WCEC To Issue \$64,000 In Refund Cks.

Patronage Refund checks totaling approximately \$64,000 will be mailed on October 31st to over 3,000 Wharton County Electric Cooperative members. This 20th patronage refund represents 25 percent of operating margins earned by these members during the years 1975 and 1976. In addition, 12.5 percent of the 1977 operating margins will be refunded.

In announcing the upcoming refund, Edward Wenden, President of WCEC, stated that the Board of Directors is pleased that refunds can be made on as current a basis as the board has approved for this year. He credits sound management, continued growth, and general prosperity of the area as reasons for the continued success of the Cooperative.

It is very important that the patronage refund checks be cashed promptly as they carry a 60-day expiration date. If you receive a check with an incorrect name or address, please advise the office as soon as possible. Wharton County Electric Cooperative has been making refunds to its member-consumers since 1957. With the October refund, the total amount returned to members is over \$755,000. Each year margins from operations (i.e. revenue less expenses) is capital credited to each member in accordance with his total dollar participation during the year. After expenses, principal payments, and necessary reserves have been established, the Board of Directors authorizes patronage refunds of any surplus to the members. All capital credits through the year 1957 have been paid to the members. Fifty percent was paid to the 1958 and 1959 members, and 25 percent to the 1960 through 1974 members has been paid.
