Rotary Has Program On Red Cross

Members of the Eagle Lake Rotary Club heard a discussion and saw films on the work of the American Red Cross at their meeting on Wednesday of last week. Bill Farris was program chairman and he introduced Roglio Colunga, division representative for the Red Cross, from Austin. Also a visitor was Mrs. Ray Elise Thomas, the president of the Colorado County chapter of the Red Cross.

To give emphasis to the fine work carried on by the Red Cross, Colunga showed, with the assistance of Tommy Pukington, two impressive films, the first on "Disaster - Sights and Sounds" and the other on "What Can A Community Do?" in cases of disaster.

Colunga, an Air Force retiree, has been with the Red Cross since 1967. He told of the busy schedule that he has been keeping this year by participating in seven disaster relief projects: floods, hurricanes and hurricanes in the year of 1975. He reported that American Red Cross has rendered over \$5 million worth of aid to disaster victims over the past year.

Colunga told about the origin of the Red Cross in Europe in 1863 and of its start, as the American Red Cross in the United States in 1881 under the leadership of Clara Barton.

The speaker told the Rotarians and guests that all of the Red Cross operations are financed entirely by donations, all made voluntarily to the organizations through local, county and state chapters.

He stressed that no Red Cross worker has the authority to accept contributions on the scene. They must be directed through local or county chapters for eventual distribution as needed by these and the national organization.

Informative leaflets on "How To Get Help" in the event of a disaster and on the community's role in a disaster situation, were distributed to those present. Copies of these may be obtained from the county Red Cross chapter through Mrs. Thomas for those persons interested.

Also information was given on Community Services Courses which are available to the public through the sponsorship of the Red Cross.

EMT Course Here One of 5 In State

The "EMS Update" published by the Texas Dept. of Health EMS Division noted that only five counties held Emergency Medical Technician training during the past year and Colorado County was included among those five.

The EMS Update stated, "The need for physician involvement and for forty hours of clinical rotation at the EMS level have been limiting factors for the training. The people of Eagle Lake in Colorado County overcame these factors and put together an EMT class for twenty-seven persons in their area."

Dr. Raymond Thomas and Dr. Jose Ugarte worked with the EMS's Herman Novak and June Mahalic to conduct the classroom portion of the school. Clinical rotations were completed at The University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston, through the cooperation of Alan Ladd, Director, Ambulatory Services, U.T.M.B.

"Thanks to all those involved with the school. Students, instructors, physicians and hospital personnel have worked together and accomplished a goal that can serve as an example to other remote counties."

Mrs. Hash's maternal grandparents established residence in Colorado County in 1829.

She was a member of the Episcopal Church in Rockport where she resided for 25 years before going to Arlington to live near her son and daughter, Jim Hash and Wayne (Jo Ann) McCreary. Also surviving are four grandchildren, Wayne McCreary, of Arlington, Jerry Reid McCreary of Wichita, Kansas, Jo Lynn Hardage of Arlington and Judy McCreary of Arlington; and also five great grandchildren, and other relatives and friends.

Services were held from the Williamsburg Chapel in Arlington at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday with the Rev. Rex Perry officiating; and were continued with interment at the Rockport Cemetery in Rockport, Texas at 2:30 p.m. Friday. Williamsburg Chapel of Arlington was in charge of arrangements.

County Extension Agents, ASCS offices, and many others in agriculture provide the necessary data which is, in turn, returned to farmers and ranchers and others in the form of accurate estimates, which are so essential in making the wisest production and marketing decisions.

County estimates for 1978 and January 1, 1979, are available on Livestock, Poultry, Dairy, Field Crops, Small Grains, Cotton, Vegetables, Fruit and Pecans, and Cash Receipts from the Sale of Texas Farm Commodities.
