

Deer Season Opens Saturday

Limit Is Two Deer,
But Only One Buck

Deer hunters should also note that:

* A resident license, costing \$5.25 is required of all Texas citizens who hunt outside of the county of their residence or who hunt deer anywhere except that persons under 17 years of age, 65 years of age or over, persons hunting on land where they reside or certain disabled veterans, may hunt deer if they possess a \$1.25 Resident Exempt Hunting license.

* Dogs may not be used to hunt deer.

* All deer must be tagged immediately upon being killed with the tag provided on the license or exempt license or exempt license and tag must be properly filled out and marked or punched and securely attached to the carcass.

* Any deer killed by one person and in the possession of another person must have all necessary tags and permits attached and signed by the person who killed the animal. Any portion of an animal given to another person must have attached a legible document signed by the person who killed the animal, stating his name, address, date of kill, hunting license number and the name of the county and ranch where the kill was made.

Legal shooting hours are sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.

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Duck Shoot Off To A Good Start

The 1979-80 duck hunting season opened Saturday, Nov. 10th and hunters in this area reported some outstanding results with lots of ducks of most species. Also the goose hunting continues to be good with lots of young birds among those being killed. The kills are expected to get even better once more cold weather brings birds into the area.

Ducks and dark geese will continue in season through Sun., Nov. 25th and then the season will be closed on ducks and dark geese until Dec. 8th at which time it will reopen and continue open through Jan. 20th.

Shooting hours are from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset; however, day hunting clubs in the area discontinue shooting at noon in order to hold the birds in this area.

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Hunter Can Influence Deer Meat Quality

Deer hunting provides both outdoor recreation and table fare—venison—for Texas sportsmen each year.

Some 11 million pounds of venison are harvested annually in Texas, points out Dr. Milo Shult, wildlife specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System.

"The hunter is the key person responsible for the quality and edibility of the venison he brings home," Shult emphasizes. "The entire process of handling the carcass from field to table can add or detract from the desirability of the final product."

Shult says a hunter plays an important role in determining whether a deer steak is tender and tasty or tough and bad flavored.

Quail Season Opens Sat., Limit Is 16

Quail will become legal targets at one-half hour before sunrise this Saturday, Nov. 17th and the season will continue open through Sunday, Feb. 17th, 1980.

In this county the limit on quail was increased this year from 12 to 16 per day, with a possession limit of 48 birds.

Ducks and light and dark geese remain in season through Sunday, Nov. 25th. On Nov. 26th the season on ducks and dark geese will close; however light geese (snows and blues) remain in season through Jan. 20th, 1980.

Also legal at this time are rail, gallinule, woodcock and snipe. The squirrel season is open all year long in this county.

Raiders Host Waller In Season Finale Fri. Nite

Loss To Columbus
Last Friday 40 to 7

The Rice Raiders will close out the 1979 football season this Friday night when they host the powerful Waller Bulldogs at Raider Stadium with kickoff scheduled for 7:30.

The Raiders, now 3-4 on the season and 2-4 in District 20AA play, dropped a 40 to 7 decision to the Columbus Cardinals last Friday night at Rice and will now open back from that defeat with a good showing this week against Waller.

The Bulldogs are currently 5-1 in district competition and in a three way tie with Columbus and Magnolia for the league lead. Waller's only loss came at the expense of Magnolia earlier in the season.

The Cards put their first points on the board with 5:27 remaining in the first period on a 16 yard pass from quarterback Matt Underwood to Tony Boone.
