Three occupants of a 1969 Pontiac escaped serious injury when their car rolled over several times in an accident at 3:30 p.m. Saturday on FM 1093, a half mile east of the Prairie River dry river in Chesterfield.

The Eagle Lake Ambulance Corps and Eagle Lake Fire Department were called to the scene. The vehicle was driven by Benjamin Cruz, who was pinned in the vehicle and was freed by the firemen and ambulance crewmen and taken to the Eagle Lake Community Hospital, although it was not thought that his injuries were serious.
