ON YOUR SINK

Low water pressure here may be caused by sediment or rust in aerators on faucets. It's the very end of the spout that has the screen on it. Aerators can be removed and cleaned. Remove the aerators with pliers, padded so the jaws won't scratch the chrome finish, wash the old rust and corrosion out of the screen on the inside, then replace. This usually solves the problem.

HOW TO MEASURE GLASS

To measure the size of glass you need, take the distance from one inside edge of the window (million wood strips) to the other and from top to bottom. Then subtract these figures by one-eighth inch. This will allow the glass to "float" in the frame and eliminate "forcing" which could break the glass. If the measurements are very difficult to make, cut a thin cardboard template to fit the opening, sanding a perfect fit and an exact measuring guide for the glass cutter. The template trick is especially useful for window frames that are slightly warped or out of square.
