Reduced Fed. Excise Tax On Phone Bills

On January 1, reduced federal excise taxes on telephone service will result in an estimated \$22.9 million savings during 1980 for customers in Texas, according to Dick Oldmixon, local manager for Southwestern Bell.

The tax will drop from its present rate of three percent to two percent, he said. This is a further step in the gradual phase-out of the telephone service excise tax instituted by Congress in 1973. The tax is scheduled to expire after 1981.

Congress first imposed the excise tax on a limited basis during World War I. Although repealed briefly after the war, it was reinstated during the Depression and has continued since then on a more extensive basis.

During the 1940's and 1950's, the rate was as high as 15 percent on local service and 25 percent on Long Distance service. From the mid 1950's until 1972, it was 10 percent on most local and Long Distance services. Since 1973, the tax rate has been reduced by one percentage point per year.
