ENERGY UPDATE

SOLAR POWER: CAN IT MEET OUR ENERGY NEEDS?

I think solar energy can, and is beginning to, make a contribution when it comes to heating water, but not when it comes to generating the energy we need on a massive scale to produce electricity.

We understand how to convert solar energy into hot water which can be used to help heat the home.

When it comes to using solar energy to generate electricity, however, the cost is much, much higher than is the cost of getting power from nuclear energy or coal. The consumer would end up paying five to 10 times what he now pays for electricity.

With solar, I don't really think that people, with all our other inflationary problems, are yet willing to pay that kind of a price for solar-generated electricity.

To produce electricity from solar energy we must be able to concentrate the solar energy. We end up having to cover square miles of land with either mirrored reflection, or photovoltaic, or something that will allow us to convert that diffuse form of energy into electricity.

And that's why the cost is so high. Then there's always the fact that the sun doesn't shine at night, and in some places at some times it shines very little during the day.

Beyond the "heating of water, which is practical and economical, the real solar application that we can expect to make economic sense is the heating of homes or space heating.

But we must remember that proper weatherstripping is the most important factor in cost effective heating of homes. The biggest savings result through insulation, regardless of how the home is heated.

We should also point out that while the heating of homes using solar energy is becoming practical in some instances, the cooling of homes by converting the energy of the sun is not yet practical. And again, the sun doesn't shine all the time. Even in California, where the sun might shine all day, it does not shine at night. We need systems that provide for our needs 24 hours a day, 12 months of the year. This means that in most places solar heating systems require back-up systems to take care of those cloudy days or chilly evenings. This adds to the cost.
