New Year Opens With Trying Situation In Iran

The intolerable situation in Iran continues. This is not good. It is not good for the hostages, for the American people, for the Iranian people, and for international order.

I am not, second guessing President Carter. If I were in his shoes, I too could not rest easy without thinking of those 50 American lives planned up by the Iranian terrorists.

In a time of international crisis, we have to back our country. Under our Constitution, he is given supreme power to handle international matters. Nor do I somehow blame the President as some are beginning to do.

But the evidence grows and grows that the Iranian situation is one of anarchy. It seems clear that there is no one to deal with who can speak with authority, and that includes the irrational Khomeini.

To put hope in the United Nations doing something is hopeless. I do not mind our trying to use the UN to help. I would just caution that we cannot expect much assistance from that body.

IRS Matches Returns With Interest Statements

Around the first of every year, your employer, bank, the company you own stock in, and others who paid you income send you statements showing wages, interest, and dividends paid to you the previous year. Later, when you file your federal income tax return, you have to include on your return the information from the statements.

Your bank, employer, etc., also send copies of these documents to Internal Revenue Service. If you're thinking that's a lot of information documents, you are right. For example, in 1977, over 494 million information returns arrived at the ten IRS Service Centers. About 275 million of them were on magnetic computer tape, disks and dickettes. The rest were paper forms.

What does the IRS do with all this information? The IRS matches as many as possible of these information returns against tax accounts of individual taxpayers in the computer system. For 1977, nearly one hundred percent of the magnetic documents were matched and about fifteen percent of the paper documents.

FPP "Steam Blowing" Begins This Week

Begins Start Up Sequence For Unit 2

"Steam blowing" - a major cleaning procedure in the startup sequence for Fayette Power Project's Unit 2 - will begin January 2. FPP plant manager Bob Kuehler has announced.

With steam blows, plant personnel will be steam cleaning the critical steam piping leading to the turbines.

Kuehler said the steam blows will be conducted on a 24 hour basis to complete the procedure as soon as possible.

The procedure forces steam through the piping at about 800 pounds of pressure, removing any debris that may be inside the piping.

"Since this steam is released externally," says Kuehler, "it does produce quite a bit of noise, but we hope our neighbors will bear with us as it is a necessary procedure."

Though the steam blows will be conducted around the clock, Kuehler estimates the cleaning "could take from one week to almost a month, depending on the amount of debris left in the piping documents."

La Grange area residents who experienced the Unit 1 steam blows last spring will know what to expect, but newcomers could find the first steam blows somewhat startling, Kuehler warns. The noise is similar to a jet airplane revving its engines for takeoff.

In a relatively undeveloped area, the sound could be heard up to a 10.15 mile radius around the plant, Kuehler says.

"Please bear with us," requests Kuehler, "and we'll get it over with as quickly as possible."

Unit 2 of the Fayette Power Project, co-owned by the Lower Colorado River Authority and the City of Austin, is expected to go on line as early as April in a test mode. Fayette County Record.
