GAS RATE ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EAGLE LAKE, TEXAS, AMENDING ANY ORDINANCE SETTING THE GAS RATES AND OTHER FEES TO BE CHARGED CONSUMERS IN THE CITY OF EAGLE LAKE, TEXAS, AND PRESCRIBING RATES, RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE FURNISHING OF GAS IN THE CITY OF EAGLE LAKE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EAGLE LAKE, TEXAS, THAT:

Sec. 1. City of Eagle Lake shall hereafter charge its residential consumers in the City of Eagle Lake for gas furnished to them in accordance with the following monthly schedule:

First 1,000 cubic feet at \$2.50
Next 4,000 cubic feet at \$4.50 per thousand
All over 5,000 cubic feet at \$1.70 per thousand
Minimum Bill of \$4.50 per month;

Sec. 2. City of Eagle Lake shall hereafter charge its consumers in the City of Eagle Lake who have elected to enter into a seasonal contract with the City for gas furnished to them in accordance with the following monthly schedule:

All Gas Purchased at \$1.50 per thousand
Minimum Bill of \$75.00 per month;

Sec. 3. Whenever the city gas rate paid by City is raised above or lowered below an assumed standard of \$0.90 per mcf, the above residential and commercial rates shall be adjusted to reflect cumulative differences to the nearest five one hundredths of a dollar per mcf. The adjustment shall be in the form of a surcharge.

Sec. 4. On and after the effective date of this ordinance, all applications for domestic gas service must be accompanied by a deposit in the amount of \$30.00 to insure full payment of any gas charges incurred by such consumer. Upon any subsequent request to disconnect or cut off gas by such consumer having such deposit, such deposit shall be returned and repaid to such consumer in full by the City, providing all bills or charges for gas consumed have been or are paid by such consumer. If there are any unpaid charges owed by such consumer having made a deposit and same are not paid, then the City shall withhold and retain as payment for such charges from such deposit the amount of the charges owing and pay the balance, if any, of such deposit to the consumer.

County Has \$51,593,405 Gross Sales In 3rd Quarter Of 1979

State Comptroller Bob Bullock last week said that 1979 third quarter gross sales in Texas passed the \$2.5 billion mark.

Bullock said an analysis of gross sales for July, Aug. and Sept. reveals that gross sales climbed nearly \$3 billion more than during the year's second quarter. The gross figures were gathered from 266,746 reporting outlets across the state.

Gross sales from 512 outlets in Colorado County for the third quarter of 1979, amounted to \$51,593,405 of which \$19,570,072 was subject to sales tax. Gross sales for the third quarter in neighboring counties amounted to: Austin County, 284 outlets, \$35,045,843; Fayette, 600 outlets, \$44,819,818; Lavaca, 462 outlets, \$39,918,149; and Wharton, 921 outlets, \$98,077,025.
