Center Sees Changes In Hunting Habits

Speaks At Rotary Club, Says Migratory Hunting Up

State Game Warden Sam Center presented the program at the meeting of the Eagle Lake Rotary Club on Wednesday last week and discussed the results of the 1979-80 hunting seasons...

Center acknowledged the fact which has been repeated many times by hunting club operators—that the past duck and goose hunting seasons were one of the best ever and probably would have been the best ever if the dry fall season and increase in soybean acreage had not been factors...

The game warden expressed concern that the increase in the soybean production in this area may have some effect in changing the migratory habits of the ducks and geese...

Center said the gathering that the deer kill this year was poor, about one-half of what it was last year. He said that estimates are that around 1500 to 2500 deer were killed in the county this past season as compared to 2500 to 4500 in 1979.

He pointed out that exceptionally heavy hunting pressure in this county, a large loss of lawn deer due to depredation caused by increasing population of foxes and coyotes in this county, and the development

Human vandals assaulted wildlife, for instance, by draining or cutting off the water supply to two fish hatcheries—killing 150,000 trout and salmon...

One of our biggest problems is with trespassing, said Center. But he noted that the officers are unable, under present law, to make an arrest unless a complaint is filed by the landowner...

Center praised the work of Deputy Game Warden Butch Herman of Eagle Lake who was commissioned under a program authorized by the department two years ago...

Center also discussed the formation of a Game Warden's Association in this state which he says will have some influence on law work for pay increases for the wardens and in legislation to make enforcement of game laws feasible.
