

Besides protecting the river valley from floods and drought, LCRA helped bring electricity to the rural areas of Central Texas. Today LCRA's electrical service area covers about 31,000 square miles, providing electricity to 11 cooperatives and 31 cities.

In addition, the Authority owns and operates 12 parks on about 2,000 acres near the Highland Lakes and the cooling ponds at the fossil and PVP plants, and over 127 has worked with the Texas Department of Health and Texas Department of Water Resources in conducting a septic system inspection program along all the Highland Lakes except Lake Austin.

LCRA is governed by a 15-member board appointed by the Governor. Its operations are directed by General Manager Charles Herring, former state senator from Austin and the fourth executive officer in the Authority's history.

Nearly 1,100 regular full-time employees, based along the river and throughout the electric service area, maintain the complex system of wires, dams, canals and power plants that comprise the modern Lower Colorado River Authority.

Our Lady Of Fatima Group Statue Presented to St. Mary's County Children's Services Bd.

Services were held prior to a 5:00 p.m. Mass last Saturday, Feb. 2nd in St. Mary's Catholic Church in Nada to bless a beautiful Our Lady of Fatima Group Statue presented to the church by Mrs. Louise Kubena of Nada and her family, in memory of their late husband and father, Ed. Kubena. The Rev. Monsignor Victor Schmidt, SJ, pastor of the church, officiated at the Blessing Ceremony and at the Mass which followed.

He expressed sincere thanks and God's best blessings upon Mrs. Kubena for donating the statue, also the Blessed Sacrament Altar and red carpeting.

Mrs. Kubena and her son, Leonard, and his wife, Maxine, and daughter, Johanna, were special guests for the ceremony.

Monsignor Schmidt said, "six times in the period from May through October of 1917, Our Lady of the Fatima appeared to three little children at Fatima, Portugal. Since that time, millions of people throughout the world have seen and heard her from every nation in the world have gone to Fatima to thank her, the mother of God, to thank her for graces received and to beg for favors of body and soul."

The statue presented to St. Mary's Church shows Our Lady of Fatima and at the base of the statue are the three youngsters to whom she appeared, Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco, on May 13, 1917. Since that time Jacinta and Francisco have deceased, but Lucia, now a Nun, still lives and continues to spread the message brought by Our Lady of Fatima, "that men leave the way to perdition and return to God, their Creator and Lord."

Mgr. Schmidt noted that incorporated on the front of Our Lady's Fatima statue, over a year in the making in Italy, is a Communist Star. Her message to the shepherds and followers was to pray the Rosary daily to prevent the spread of Communism. One of the glowing examples of the success of these prayers came about in Austria which fell under the communist regime in 1945, but was liberated from communism in 1955 after more than ten percent of the 60 million people of that country offered a Rosary every day and asked God to free them of communism.

In February of last year St. Mary's Church was honored to have on display for two days, the Fatima Statue of Our Lady of Fatima which was blessed by Pope Paul VI and presented to the people of the United States by the Bishop of Fatima.
