Traffic Coming On, Off Interstate Has Right-of-Way

I would like to bring to the attention of our citizens a change in the traffic law concerning freeway frontage roads. The change is so important that ignoring it could literally become a matter of life or death. The law, passed in the re-session of the Texas Legislature, gives traffic entering or leaving a freeway ramps the right of way over frontage road traffic. Many ramps on Texas highways are arranged in a "Y" shape, and the signs are in place on the frontage roads for this kind of operation. Other places where the ramps and frontage roads meet, however, are not. There, the signs are not in place to require the ramp traffic to yield. Just remember, traffic coming off the Interstate has the right of way over the frontage road traffic.
