But last week, I was one of several House members who opposed the conference report on HB 4960, the banking deregulation bill. This measure will probably pass the Senate with equal ease and become law. My vote reflects reservations that the bill begins to make all financial institutions—the same—under the same rules. In other words, the bill begins a trend where there will be no savings and loans or credit unions, just banks. I don't think our banks, or S&Ls, or credit unions want that.
