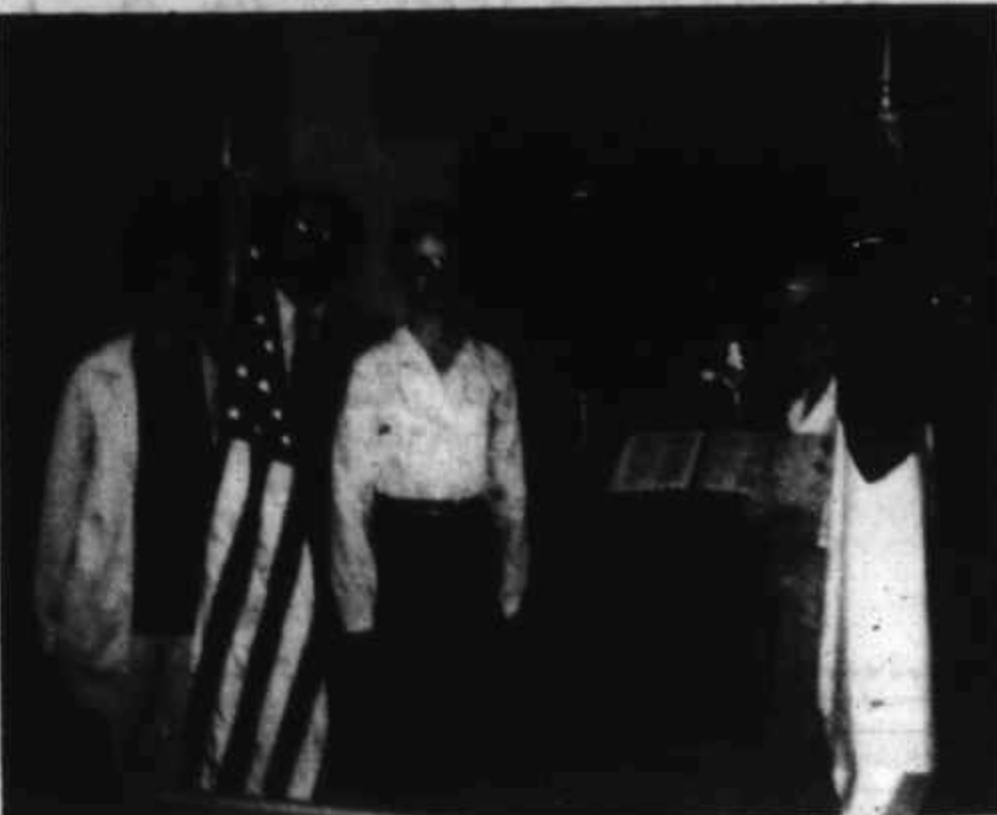


VFW Auxiliary Presents Flags To Hosp. Chapel
