 John Schneider was the winning pitcher. He came in in the 6th inning, relieving pitcher Gary Kocurek, with a tied score. He pitched the last two innings, in which he struck out one and walked two.
 Coach Zimmerhazel commented, "I think this has been our best offensive output of the year. We had a total of 10 hits. As for the defense, I think we looked ridiculous. We were winning 9-1 at one point in the game, then our defense seemed to fall apart."
 The Raiders are now 2-3 in the season.
 Spot Light On Appel: The Raider Spot Light would now like to focus on Darrel Appel, a member of the senior class. Darrel plays the position of center field and wears the number 1. This is his third year to letter on the varsity squad.
 Darrel is also involved in other sports at Rice, such as basketball, in which he made All District, and tennis.
 When asked his feelings on the team, Darrel replied, "This year's team is as strong as last year's. But we have not yet shown our capabilities in district play. In previous years we looked pretty good. When district started, our best pitcher was injured and we weren't hitting up to our potential. The district is balanced as far as who could win it and if we can win six out of our next seven games we could end up number one. But for this to happen, we must hit the ball very well. I have confidence in my defense."
