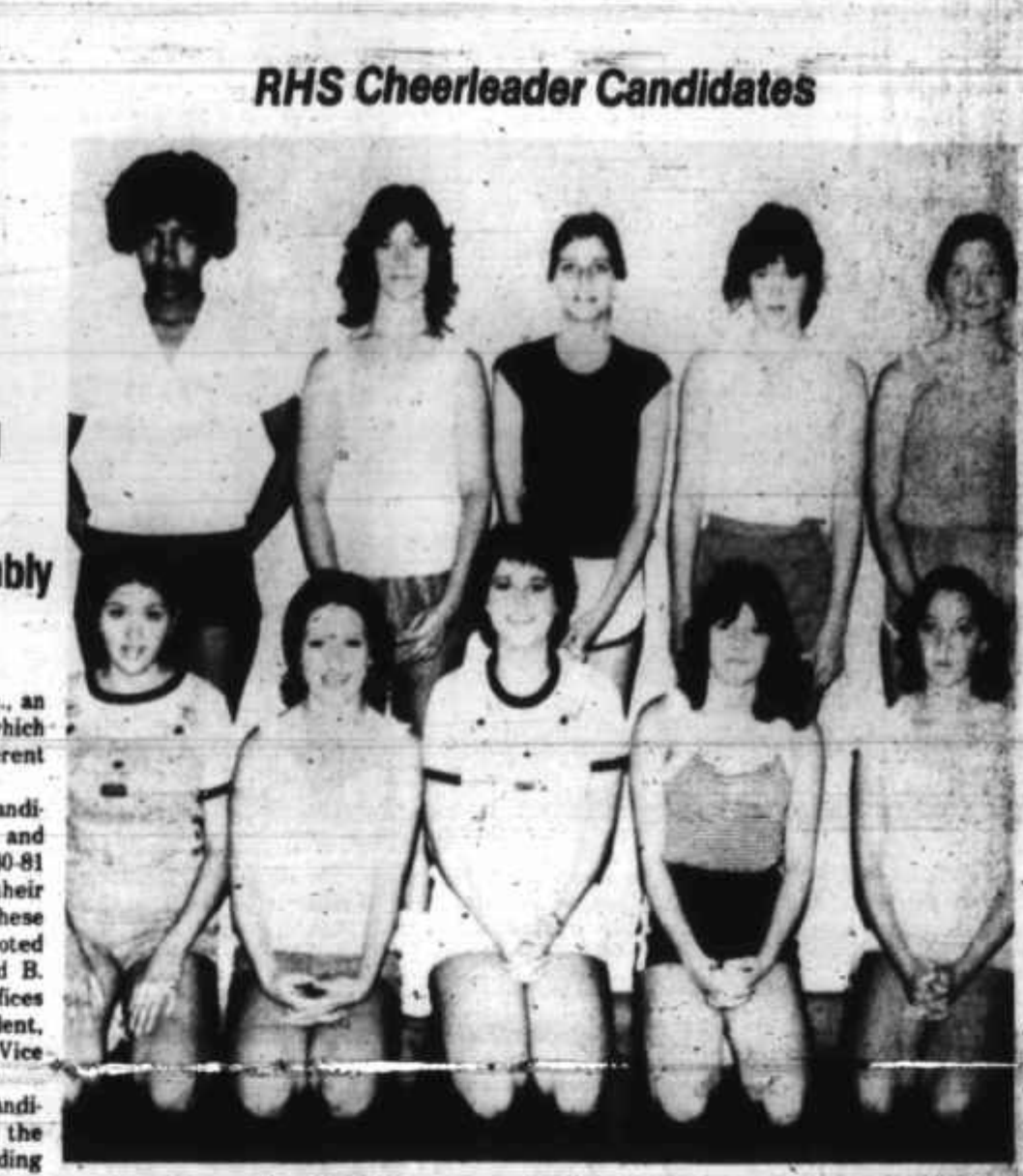

**3 Test Dates For WCJC Voc. Nursing Left**

Only three more testing dates are left to qualify for enrollment in the next vocational nursing class at Wharton County Junior College in Wharton where the twelve-month program begins August 25.

Pre-entrance tests have been scheduled May 10, May 21 and June 4 at 9 a.m. in Room 214 of the J. R. Peace Building. Fee is \$10.

Students rotate through a schedule of all nursing services at affiliated hospitals four days per week during the final 22 weeks of the program. Participating institutions include Wharton's Gulf Coast Medical Center and Caney Valley Hospital, El Campo Memorial Hospital, Eagle Lake Community Hospital and Columbus Community Hospital.
