### Highway Dept. Pre-Const. Meeting Held

A pre-construction meeting was held at 10:30 a.m. Friday, May 30 at the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation District Office in Yaokum outlining construction plans for the seal coat projects awarded to Clark Construction Company, Inc. of San Antonio. The contract includes work in Calhoun, Colorado, DeWitt, Fayette, Gonzales, Jackson, Lavaca, Victoria and Wharton Counties. The amount of the bid was \$789,909.23 and the work will take approximately 40 working days to complete. E. J. Blaschke, senior resident engineer in charge of the project, said, "A total of 112 miles of road will be repaved to preserve the roads and provide a skid resistant surface for the motorists. The asphalt will be applied in half widths in most cases to facilitate the handling of traffic. The traveling public should use caution in traveling through the construction areas which will be marked with signs and barricades. Flagmen will be assisting traffic whenever work is in progress." The contractor was represented by A. J. Clark, Jr., who said, "Work will begin Monday, June 16 and should be completed by the end of July."

### Market Report

Columbus Livestock Market handled 689 head of cattle at the May 29th sale with owners reporting the market about steady with the previous week's good market. Packer cows-bulls were reportedly the only classes to see some weakness, selling \$2 to \$3 hundred lower. Stocker cattle sold with the same strong demand. Good to choice butcher calves and yearlings sold 50 to 65, heavier packer cows 50 to 60; and commercial packer bulls 54c to 58.5c. Heavy Hereford and Angus steer calves brought 65 to 85 and heifers 60 to 70 while crossbred steer calves went 65 to 80 and heifers 60 to 70. Good stocker cows and heifers sold for \$400 to \$500. No. 1 hogs brought 30 to 32.5c and lambs 50 to 60c.
