This will allow many of our citizens to be out boating, swimming, motorboating, fishing, etc. I would like to encourage everyone to take advantage of all safety devices at their disposal. I hope that everyone has a joyous, safe, and mishap-free summer vacation.

May 1: Issued three citations to truck drivers for speeding and one for improper registration. Investigated a disturbance in Alleyton. Assisted with traffic at scene of fire in Columbus.
