**Boys State In Session This Week**  
More than 900 Texas high school juniors are in Austin on the Campus of the University of Texas for the 40th session of American Legion Boys State, State Commander, Mike D. Miralles of San Antonio announced.  
The junior high school Boys State delegates arrived in Austin on Saturday, June 7. That evening the new citizens of Boys State attended the first orientation in their assigned mythical Boys State city to start the week long program. A program that teaches responsibilities of citizenship in an actual "do it yourself" type workshop from which comes its motto, "Learn by Doing."  
This Friday, June 13, the citizens of Boys State will visit the State Capitol and actually sit in chairs of the office to which they were elected and physically run the state government for a day.  
Boys State enrollment for Texas this year brings the total to 23,888 high school juniors who have attended in the past four decades, since 1940, when Boys State was first inaugurated in Texas.

**Austin Comm. Court To Call Jail Bond Election**  
A \$500,000 bond issue for the construction of a new jail facility in Austin County will be put before public vote on Saturday, July 19, according to a decision of the Austin County Commissioners Court in the June 2 meeting. The jail is to be designed after the one presently under construction in Fort Bend County, except on a small scale.  
"We're looking at around a 36 to 38 inmate capacity jail with sheriff's office plus justice of the peace and dispatcher's offices," said County Judge LeRoy Grebe following the meeting. The judge was authorized by the court to execute a contract with Christopher DiStefano and Associates to be the architectural firm for the new proposed jail.  
The jail is to be located at the old power farm "local" in Bellville. This is county property and is in the northern part of that city. Sealy News.

The bride, given in marriage by the groom's grandfather, wore a candlelight gown of point d'esprit and banded lace. The lace empire bodice featured a sheer cameo yoke outlined in a ruffle of the banded lace with a high neckline and long fitted sleeves. Point d'esprit and the banded lace gave a tiered effect to the tunic skirt that fell to a deep flounce at the hemline which continued around the chapel length train. To complement the gown, the bride wore a matching picture hat. She carried a lace bridal fan with an arrangement of peach gladioli surrounding a white orchid and fern with long peach satin streamers.
