State H.S. Rodeo Begins This Wed.

The 1980 State Rodeo, sponsored by the Texas State Rodeo Assn., is set for Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday in Hallettsville's 5000-seat arena.

There will be night performances only, and both high school and elementary cowboys will perform before expected large audiences.

All usual events, plus special attractions, will be on the program, with added attractions yet to be announced.

A big Western Parade will be a usual highlight of the rodeo event, in downtown Hallettsville, Friday, June 20, at 4:00 p.m.

June 18th is Family Night, when all children 12 years and under will be admitted free; above 12 years 50 cents. Children must accompany parents who pay regular admission.

Admission prices are: Box Seats \$250; General Admission, Adults \$20; Children \$10. Season Tickets (all four nights) are available upon request.

A saddle will be given away as first prize in each high school event.

High school graduates who have not taken an ACT or SAT test but plan to attend Wharton County Junior College in Wharton this fall have three opportunities this summer to participate in an ACT Residual Test according to Billy Griffith, counselor.

The ACT Assessment Program is a guidance-oriented service that is used each year by students throughout the nation as part of their college and career planning.

The ACT Residual Test will be administered Wednesday, June 25 at 8 a.m. in Room 102 of the J.R. Peace Building. The test will also be given at the same place and time on Wednesday, July 9 and Friday, August 1. A final residual test is scheduled September 6 after final semester classes begin on September 8.

The fee is \$5 and it takes students about three and one-half hours to complete four standardized exams covering subject areas of English, math, science and natural sciences.

It is not a "pass-fail" test but scores are designed to provide an assessment of general educational development.

Checks for \$5 should be payable to Wharton County Junior College. If cash, the exact amount should be ready when fees are collected at the beginning of the test.

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Dr. Norrie (Jim) Reed Has Surgery For Choking Problem

Thirteen years ago, Gaston, North Carolina, veterinarian Jim Reed, known to friends here as Norrie Reed, son of Mrs. W. C. Reed of Rosenberg, had a choking problem which almost cost him his life.

Doctors said he had a digestive system malfunction they said wasn't curable and would plague him the rest of his life, according to a story in the Charlotte (N.C.) Observer.

Reed, 55, underwent surgery in April and it is hoped the problem will be cured. Doctors stretched Reed's esophagus, relocated his stomach and wrapped part of the stomach around part of the esophagus.

A medical team headed by Dr. John Sessions, a professor at University of North Carolina's School of Medicine, performed the surgery. Sessions said that the severity of Reed's problem is uncommon, but not rare, said the Observer.

Dr. Reed is reported to be eating solid food now and is looking forward to returning to practice in his Gaston, North Carolina, home.

Friends in the area join in wishing Dr. Reed continued recovery to good health.

The final week of Little League action settled championships in two leagues, but the Major Little League ended in a tie as the Pirates and Yanks were named co-champions of the league for the 1980 summer season.

In the final week of play the Giants edged the Pirates for the Farm Little League title and the Eagles captured the Girls Major Softball Loop.

The Reds completed an undefeated season with a win over the Mets in the last game of the season. The Reds topped the Astros 17 to 11 and Giants topped the Pirates 11 to 4 in what later proved to be the difference in the league title.

In action last Tuesday night the Cubs made a bid for their first win but their last inning rally fell short and they lost to the Dodgers 13 to 12. Steve Almanza had 2 hits and 2 runs in the victory.

The Dodgers, John Ramirez led the Cubs with 3 hits and 3 runs. Paul Cordova and Curtis Rose had a home run and a triple.

In the second game Tuesday the Yanks scored four times in the sixth to defeat the Pirates 10 to 7. Arthur Foster led off for the Yanks with a home run and also added a single. Raymond Thomas had 2 hits, Rodney Williams and Kevin Amos 3 each. Paul Cordova and Kevin Dornack had the only Pirate hits.

Friday night, the Dodgers scored 8 times in the third to make the difference in their 11 to 6 upset of the Yanks. Ernest Lemons and Raymond Thomas were the scorers.

The Pirates and Yanks shared the Major Little League title with a 10 to 1 victory over Flatonia at Rice High School stadium Monday afternoon. The Lakers are sponsored by First National Bank and managed by Charles Darnell and Donnie Perry.

They have a perfect 5-0 record and will wind up their regular schedule with a game in Flatonia at 7:30 p.m. this Thursday, June 19th.

As champions of their zone, the Lakers draw a bye in the zone tournament which will be held next week and will not see action until Friday night of next week. After the zone tournament, All-Stars will be named and Darnell and Perry and the coach of the second place winner will manage the All-Stars in further Senior Little League competition leading to the national title.

In the game with Flatonia, Alex Ramirez was in control on the pitcher's mound, giving up only 3 hits as he struck out 11. He got good defensive and offensive support from teammates as the Lakers chalked up the 10-1 win.

The Lakers had six hits including a 3-RBI triple by Michael Davis, a hit by Ramirez, a 2-RBI hit by Troy Corman, another hit by Mike Thomas and two by James Powell. Coach Darnell says the play of the Lakers has been outstanding all season long.
