To regular readers of this newsletter, today's topic is familiar, but the news is more upbeat. The House this week finally adopted the first budget resolution for Fiscal Year 1981 which is in balance.

A balanced budget has not occurred in the last twelve years. However, the compromise which led to this action and the conditions which enable the balance are both tenuous. I must admit that the cause for a balanced budget is walking a thin tightrope, and only a very small net would catch its fall.

After several weeks of squabbling which threw the resolution past its May 15 deadline for adoption, House and Senate conferees approved a \$613.5 billion budget, including \$153.7 billion for defense, the area where the most heated debate occurred.
