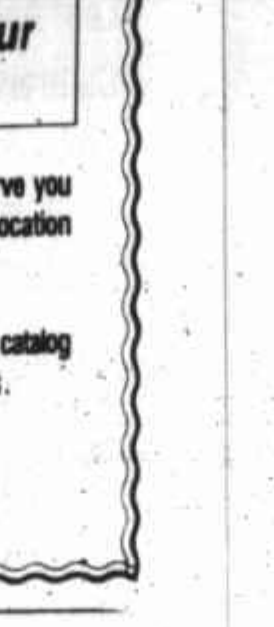
Also, all planted peanut acreage must be certified by July 15.

Disaster Provisions: Participating farms that might have a disaster affected crop for reasons beyond your control should file a disaster report "574" with the ASFC office and let an employee of the County Committee make an appraisal before the land or crop is put to other use. This must be done within 15 days after abandonment of the crop, or if the crop is carried through to harvest and a low yield exists, you have 15 days to file a disaster form at the ASFC office.

The interest rate on all 1980 commodity loans has been reduced to 11.5%. However, the interest rate on farm facility loans remains at 13%.

Rice Production Records: Rice producers are reminded to submit their 1979 production records in order for the ASFC office to complete 1980 pay yield. Only final settlement sheets will be accepted.

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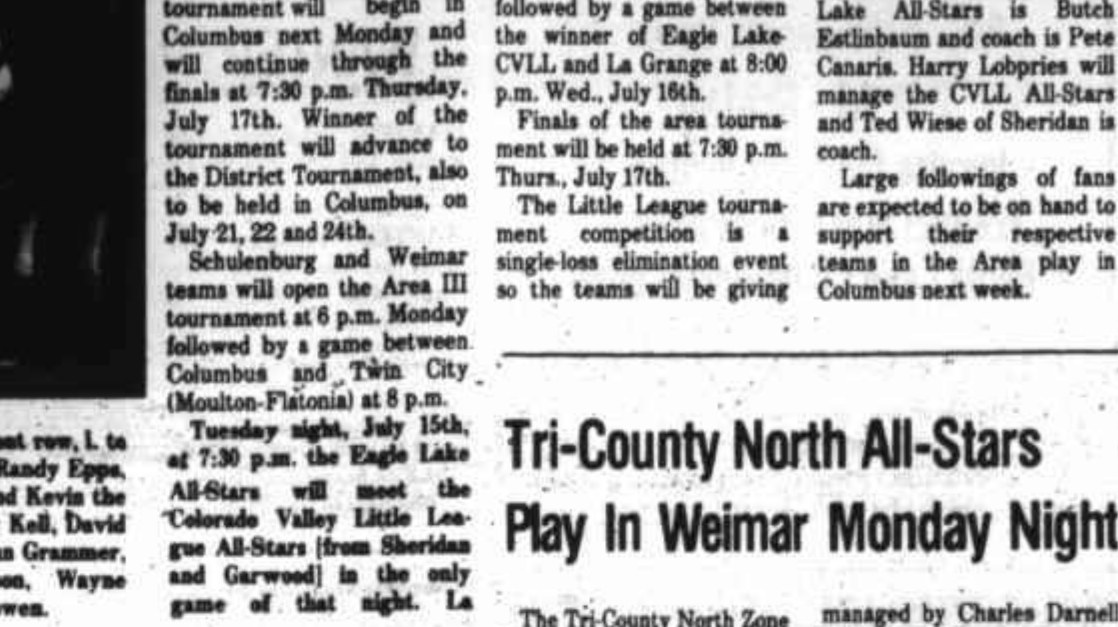
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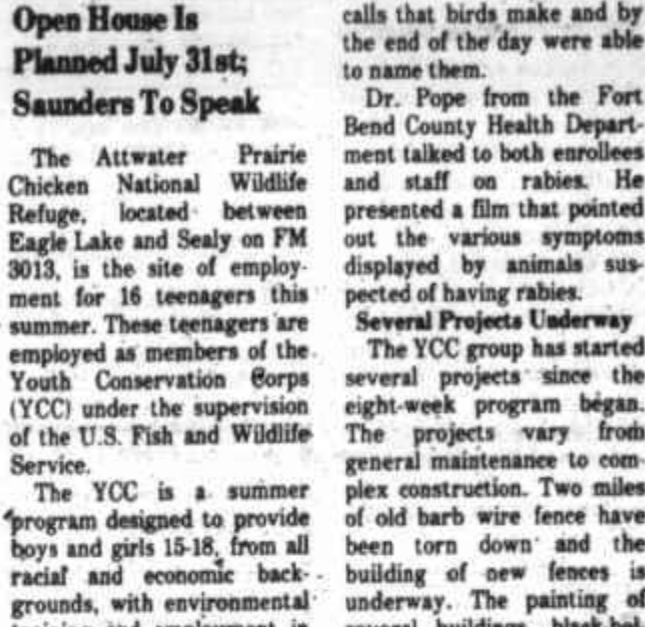
