Food Stamps Also Available From SS Office

In the past, people who wanted to apply for food stamps could only do so through food stamp or welfare offices.

Now the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Social Security Administration have made arrangements for certain people to apply for food stamps through Social Security offices.

A person may apply for food stamps at a Social Security office under the following conditions:

- 1) If you and your household (all the people who live and eat with you) are applying for Supplemental Security Income, the federal program for needy aged, blind and disabled.
- 2) Or, if you and your household already receive Supplemental Security Income but are not receiving food stamps.

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
