TODAY'S MOBILE HOMES

MOBILE HOMES APPRECIATE
 Important information does exist which strongly indicates that mobile home values today appreciate. One of the more recent studies along this line shows that mobile homes in four Southern California counties - Los Angeles, Riverside, San Bernardino, Orange - increased in value at a rate comparable to site-built housing. Using resale statistics from the California Multiple Listing Service, the study discovered that mobile homes appreciated at an overall average rate of 23.4 percent annually, and single-section homes increased by 17.1 percent during the study period. These figures do not include the appreciation of the land on which the homes were located since all were in rental parks, but does include subsequent improvements made to the homes.
