Use Precautions
In Cashing
Check For Strangers

I would like to again take this opportunity to advise our citizens they should take precautions when accepting a check from someone. Every merchant or person accepting a check should obtain some information to allow law officers to take action should the check not be any good. Without a physical description of the person, the Sheriff's Office is unable to have a warrant served outside of the county. Always get the person's driver's license number. With that number, the Sheriff's Office can obtain a physical description of the person who gave the check. If they have no driver's license, check some other type of identification such as a date of birth, social security number, etc. Remember, we are here to serve you. You can assist us and yourself by obtaining this information when accepting a check, which in turn will assist us in taking action to assist you if the check is no good.
