Alert To Parents: Cystic Fibrosis Kills Young

This week, September 21-27 is National Cystic Fibrosis Week. The purpose of the week is to increase public awareness and understanding of cystic fibrosis (CF), the number one genetic killer of young people in the United States.

Volunteers are walking their blocks during this week to educate the public and raise money for CF. Many of the signs of CF are common to other respiratory and digestive disorders - if your child has any of the following signs, do not assume he has CF, but do consult with your doctor about the possibility of CF. Early diagnosis and treatment help in prolonging lives, so be alert to recurrent wheezing; persistent coughing/excessive mucus; Pneumonia more than once; excessive appetite/poor weight gain; clubbing tip-

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NFIB Honors Cong. Pickle

The National Federation of Independent Business (NFIB), the largest organization representing small business people in the nation, announced last week that U.S. Rep. J. J. (Jake) Pickle has been honored with their prestigious "Guardian of Small Business Award" and has been endorsed by NFIB's Political Action Committee for re-election.

The Central Texas Congressmen received the award for voting in support of key small business issues 90 percent or more of the time during the 96th Congress. In announcing the award, Wilson S. Johnson, president of the 600,000-member group, explained that "The Guardian Award gives recognition to legislators who support small business. As the days pass, it assures our members of how their legislators are representing them in Congress."

Dick Fisher, chairman of NFIB's Political Action Committee, noted that the endorsement of Representative Pickle "comes after close scrutiny of his overall legislative record, which clearly shows a concern for the 12 million or so small business operations in the country today."

NFIB, a non-profit and non-partisan group, presents its Guardian Awards at the end of each Congress to those members who vote in favor of small business on selected issues at least 70 percent of the time. A total of 195 representatives and 30 senators qualified for the award this year.

Among issues considered were legislation that would prohibit inspectors of the Occupational Safety and Health Agency from visiting a work site within six months of an inspection by a state safety and health agency; ban the federal conservation plan from restricting the operating hours of a business; allow

The program was given by Donella Pustol, Colorado County Extension Agent, on macramé. Members participated in making hanging baskets.

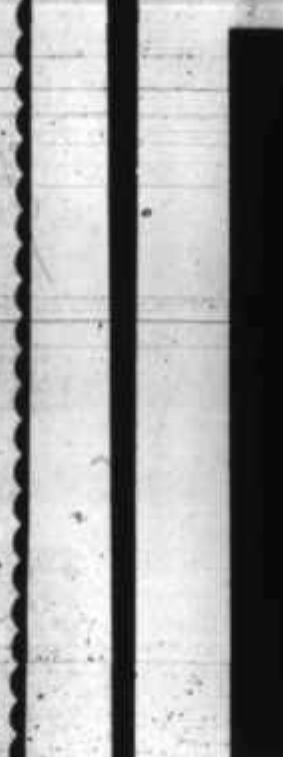
