## ELMS 7th Grade Raiders Beat Sealy 20 to 8; 8th Grade Loses

### 7th and 8th Grade Raiders Beat Sealy This Thursday Night

The Eagle Lake Middle School Raiders split a pair of football games played in Sealy last Thursday night with the seventh grade winning 20 to 8 and the eighth graders losing 18 to 8.

This Thursday both ELMS teams will be back at home hosting the Bellville seventh and eighth graders for games beginning at 5:30 and 7:00 p.m. at the ELMS football field.

The seventh grade Raiders got back on the winning track during action against the Sealy Tigers last week with a 20 to 8 victory.

Donald Spears got the Raiders on the scoreboard early in the contest with a six yard run in the first period. The Raiders added another score in the second period with a 17 yard pass play from Spears to end Cleveland Scott. The two point conversion was successful giving

the Raiders, coached by Freddie Armstrong and Le-Nel Eshberger, are now 2-1 in the season, their only loss coming from Waller 2 weeks ago in the district opener.

## Rice JV Bombs Sealy To Remain Unbeaten

The Rice Raider junior varsity earned its sixth straight win this season, without a loss, in a superb 43 to 0 victory over the Sealy Tigers last Thursday night at Rice Stadium.

The Raiders, coached by G.D. Stalham and David White, were led by Kenneth Hemphill who scored three touchdowns and Troy Corman who threw for two scores and ran 21 yards for another.

This Thursday the Raiders will look for win number seven battling the Bellville Brahmas in a game starting at 7:30 p.m. in Bellville. Prior to that contest will be a game between the Raider freshmen and Bellville at 5:30.

It was all Kenneth Hemphill in the first half of last week's win at Sealy. He scored all 22 of Rice's points.

He opened the scoring, after Sealy fumbled on the first play following the kickoff, on a drive-capping one yard run. He added another six-point in the initial period on a 72 yard run and extra point runs following both scores to make it 18-0.

In the lone second quarter, Hemphill broke loose

for 25 yards to paydirt to end first half scoring at 22 to 0.

Corman leads Red Bull. Neither team put points on the board in the third period but in the final quarter quarterback Troy Corman led the team to three more touchdowns.

The first came on a Corman pass to Ricky Toliver good for 39 yards. Corman ran in on the conversion to up the lead to 30 to 0.

Later in the period Corman hit Phillip Schorlemmer from two yards out and with the missed kick, Rice led 36 to 0. The final score came on a 21 yard keeper by Corman. James Powell kicked the extra point to end scoring at 43 to 0.

The Raiders led by Hemphill with 204 yards rushing, outran the Tigers 278 to 44 on the ground with Rice collecting 10 first downs.

Showing Thursday's game in Sealy, the Raiders will play their next game in Garwood hosting Waller on Oct. 30th.

## Doe Permit Areas Designated



## Doe Permits To Be Issued In County Oct. 30-31

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department will issue antelope (doe) permits for Colorado County in the Columbus City Hall from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Thursday and Friday, Oct. 30th and 31st.

See map above for doe permit designated areas in this county.

For the issuance of doe permits in the county this year, there are two designated areas, one for issuance on the basis of one permit for 135 acres and the other for one permit for 100 acres.

The 1980 season will open on Saturday, Nov. 16th with a limit of three deer but only one may be a buck and that includes a spike buck. The other two must be antelope deer and they may be killed only in the designated areas if the hunter has in possession a doe permit which had been issued by P&W Dept. to the landowner on Oct. 30th or 31st.

Parks and Wildlife biologists said that landowners note that the permits will be issued in the Columbus city hall, not the courthouse. Also a landowner must have at least one acre of the area required for a designated area (i.e. at least 12 in the 1-100 acre permit and 1-100 acres for the first permit).

The area of 100 acres will be located on the south of the 100 acre permit area south of the county line and north of Highway 90A to FM 2604 east to an area north of IH 10 and by the Colorado River to the east. The one permit to 135 acres area extends past north of IH 10 to the Lavaca County line, to the Lone Oak and Fredericksburg communities and northeast to FM 940 to Cel Spring and the slinky road from Ramsey to just east of the river bridge at ANAH.

The area south of FM 940 and 90A including the Rock Island and Eagle Lake areas is not included in the doe permit area.

Also stipulated are the Weimar area and a small area including Columbus and just west of Columbus and a small strip from Gilmerton to Borden on each side of IH 10.

Landowners should bring proof of ownership with them when they make application for the permit Oct. 30th and 31st.

## Rice "Storms" Past Sealy 40-8 In Rain Delayed Game Last Fri.

Rain, lightning caused delay of over one hour prior to kick off.

Last Friday night's District 22AAA football contest between the Rice Raiders and Sealy Tigers was almost postponed because of a torrential downpour and terrifying electrical storms that passed over Sealy and lasted for over an hour.

But the storm passed by and the game started at 8:00 p.m. with Rice on top 6 to 0. Earnest Fields carried in on the conversion and Rice led 8 to 0.

About five minutes later, the Raiders got possession on their own 33 yard line and struck again with halfback Earnest Fields breaking loose on a 67 yard streak to put Rice up 14 to 0. James Rhodes, seeing his first action of the year, kicked the extra point to make it 14 to 0.

David Hunt passed by and with 2:30 left in the period, the Raiders shocked the Tiger defense one more time with a 60 yard touchdown run by "Dave" to make it 21 to 0.

The Raiders failed to get on the board again in the first half of play and saw their 21 point lead cut to 13 with just 2:34 left in the half when the Tigers scored their only points of the night from 21 yards out on a running play and then scored two extra points on a passing play to end scoring in the first half at 21 to 8.

On the Raiders' first possession of the second half, after forcing a punt by the Tigers, they moved the ball to about midfield when, despite the slight drizzle and sloppy field conditions, they suffered their only fumble of the night with Sealy recovering in the Rice 44.

But a pass attempt on first down was picked off by defensive back Robert Barrios on the play and the Raiders took over on their 41. From there, with the aid of a pass from Kenneth Hyek to his arms and he dodged a couple of would be tacklers, then broke loose for a 60 yard touchdown punt return. The punt was a 40 yard punt, all scoring in the game with 41 seconds left in the third period.

Sealy threatened with only seconds left in the game, but a tough Raider defense drowned the effort with defensive back John Dawson ending the threat with a pass interception in the end zone as the final seconds ticked off the clock.

Barrios Makes Big Play

On Sealy's next possession, they went to the air once again and once again Barrios was in the way, this time making a sensational interception to give Rice the ball on Sealy's 45. On the first down, the Raiders went to the man with the hot hands as Hyek connected with Barrios across the middle on a post pattern and the 5'10" 140 lb. lightning bolt streaked 56 yards to the end zone untouched. Rhodes' kick following the touchdown

ended the game with a 40 to 8 final score.

The Raiders also boast a fine receiving corps with ends Robert Barrios and Robert Frazier teaming with quarterback Hyek. Hyek has completed 22 of 56 this season for 409 yards with four going for touchdowns. Barrios was on the receiving end of one of those TD passes Friday night's good for 30 yards.

It takes Barrios' 10th game reception of his career good for a new school record.

The key to a good offense is a good line and last week's starters Michael Frazier, Dwight Pangel, Johnny Gayles, Mike Rice and Larry Haynes did a good job of opening holes and pass blocking.

Defensively, the Raiders were led last week by Calvin Foster with seven tackles including two sacks and a touchdown setting up fumble recovery. Barrios was also a top performer with eight tackles and two pass interceptions. Other stand-outs were Gonzalez with nine tackles, Johnson with 10 and Troy Grounds, Jeff Penell and Haynes with one sack each. Davis and John Dawson each had one interception in the contest.

Don't expect the Raider football team to make any guest appearances on TV anytime soon, but according to Coach Darden, the Raiders' singing is as good as the White Shadow's Show Choir. Darden's been pretty impressed with the performance of his team on the field but even more so on the bus traveling home. "Those guys can really sing," he says. Some of Darden's favorites are "Gilligan's Island" and the "Beverly Hillsbillies".

## Hunters Awaiting Duck, Goose Season

Two sure signs of fall are frosty mornings and the looks of wild geese winging their way southward.

This year it appears there will be ample flights of all game species for a good hunting season, and the birds should find fairly good habitat conditions when they arrive in Texas, according to Charles Stalham, waterfowl project leader for the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

For the portion of Texas west of U.S. Highway 80, the goose season is Oct. 26, 1980 through Jan. 15, 1981. East of the Highway (which includes this area), the season will be Nov. 2, 1980 through Jan. 15, 1981.

Ducks will also become sight targets on Nov. 16th and remain in season through Nov. 20th. The duck season is closed Dec. 1-12 but resumes Dec. 12th and stays open
