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**Oil, Gas Tests At Matthews, Rock Is, Nade**

Oil and gas drilling locations were reported in this part of the county.

Texas Oil and Gas Corp. of Corpus Christi will drill the No. 1 McClanahan in the East Matthews Field three miles northeast of Eagle Lake. The well is projected to 10,000 feet and is on a 820-acre lease in the Patience Brophy Survey 2, A-281.

Two new locations in the Rock Island area are the Middleton Oil Co. No. 1 Ross E. Miller, a 3,500 foot test two miles northwest of Rock Island on a 160-acre lease in the "G" RR Co. Survey 2, A-282.

Other new locations are: Realities Energy Corp. of Houston, No. 1 H. Ammann, a 10,000 foot test on a 820 acre lease in the Jason Alexander Survey 5, A-778; and the No. 1 Fling, also a 10,000 foot test, on a 320 acre lease in the I&GN RR Co. Survey 51, A-308.

**County Judges Endorse Kent Caperton**

County judges throughout the Fifth Senatorial District have endorsed Democratic nominee Kent Caperton in his bid for the Texas Senate.

Dick Holmgren, Brazos County Judge, announced in a Bryan news conference.

"Although county government deals effectively with many of the concerns of our citizens, our state government must lead the way in solving those problems which cross county lines and those which face the entire state," said Holmgren.

"Accordingly, I and the other county judges who reside in this Senatorial District endorse and recommend Kent Caperton to the voters," Holmgren stated.

In addition to Holmgren, county judges who endorsed Caperton include Leroy Grebe of Austin County; Lester Crum of Colorado County; Daniel Sklar of Wharton County; and others.

**Interest On Savings Bonds Increased**

Secretary of the Treasury William Miller has announced that President Carter approved a 1 percent increase in the interest rate paid on United States Savings Bonds and Savings Notes.

The President acted after signing legislation permitting the Secretary of the Treasury, with the President's approval, to raise Savings Bonds interest rates by up to 1 percent during any 6-month period. Previously the interest rate ceiling was fixed by statute.

The interest rate on Series EE Bonds purchased on and after November 1, 1980, is being increased from 7 percent to 8 percent, compounded semiannually, when the Bonds are held to original maturity. The term to maturity is being shortened from 11 to 9 years.

The interest rate on Series HH Savings Bonds purchased on and after November 1, 1980, is being increased from 6 1/2 percent to 7 1/2 percent to their original maturity, which remains at 10 years. Interest on these Bonds is paid semiannually by check.

All outstanding Series E, EE, H and HH Savings Bonds, as well as outstanding Savings Notes (Freedom Shares) will also benefit from a 1 percent increase to their net maturities.

Continuing benefits of Series EE Bonds include their exemption from State and local income taxes, the option to defer Federal income taxes on accrued interest, the low minimum purchase price of \$25, and the right to redeem the Bonds anytime after six months at issue price plus accrued interest.

Treasury hopes that the higher interest rates will increase purchases of Savings Bonds, particularly through payroll savings plans, as well as reduce redemptions. The unprecedented market interest rates during the past year have resulted in a heavy volume of redemptions and declining sales.

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**Highway Dept. WCJC Pioneers OK's Funds For Daze Fun Run Hwy. 71 Rway Sat., Nov. 22**

The State Highway and Public Transportation Commission has given the go-ahead for acquiring right of way for the improvement of another section of State Highway 71 in Colorado County.

The commission approved an estimated \$500,000 to acquire additional right of way needed from the Fayette County line to 3.5 miles north of Interstate Highway 10 at Columbus, a distance of approximately 8.6 miles.

The project will mark another step in the complete upgrading of S.H. 71 from Columbus to Austin.
