County Had \$6,705,151 Gross Taxable Sales For 2nd Quarter

State Comptroller Bob Bullock reports that gross sales in Texas continued to climb in the second quarter of 1980.

Bullock said a sales tax analysis of gross sales for April, May and June of this year shows that gross sales totaled more than \$6.7 billion, up \$3.8 billion over the first quarter of 1980. He added that second quarter gross sales during the same period in 1979 by more than \$1.1 billion.

Colorado County's 465 outlets reported gross taxable sales of \$6,705,151 for the second quarter of 1980 and of that amount only

\$16,486,491 was subject to sales tax. Austin County's 410 outlets had gross sales of \$36,450,654; Fayette County with 519 outlets reported \$46,405,010 gross sales; Lavaca County, 389 outlets, \$28,746,204 gross sales; and Wharton County with 809 outlets had \$111,286,615 in gross sales.

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Entex Changing Out Meters, Checking For Gas Leaks
