Mrs. Ida Canney of Eagle Lake was one of many students listed on the honor roll at the University of Texas.

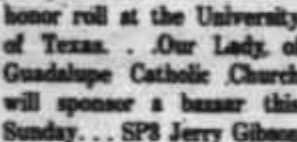
Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic Church will sponsor a bazaar this Sunday.
