implemented, would go into effect Jan. 1, 1981.

William J. Boymer of Austin, with the Department of Agriculture's environmental protection division, pointed out that the planting of cotton normally is restricted to begin no earlier than March 15 under pH soil control regulations.

A number of the landowners who made the original application were present for the meeting Monday and testified as to damage received by cotton crops, gardens and other foliage in the southern part of the county on repeated occasions. This fact was attested to by other Department of Agriculture representatives present including Charles Leason of Weimar, Noah Kline of Hallettsville and Carl S. Rost of Giddings.

Several kinds of 2,4-D Arthur Mahalite, Eagle Lake farmer and rancher, noted that there are three kinds of 2,4-D in use in the area. "What kind are we talking about?"

Boymer responded by saying that there is a highly volatile ester, low volatile ester and non-volatile amine 2,4-D in use. Leason said that damage had been found from an aerial application of the amine variety for a distance of 12 miles or more.

Mahalite and Vance Duncan, also an Eagle Lake rancher, said that the March 1st cutoff would severely restrict the control of weeds on pasture lands thereby reducing the number of cattle

that might be grazed on those lands. They stated that by that early date the weeds have not sufficiently grown to a point that they would be affected by the 2,4-D. Mahalite pointed out further that winds in March sometimes restrict the number of days available for application of 2,4-D since regulations set out that the herbicide cannot be applied with winds up to a certain level.

After much discussion by the group and the officials present, the court adopted a sort of compromise in which the use of the 2,4-D will be banned for the period of March 15th through July 31st in all of the area south of U.S. Highway 90A, Precinct 4 Commissioner Bill Stiles voted against the motion to forward the resolution to the State Commissioner and Commissioners Otto Loesain, Rafael Veselka and Crockett Levenhede voted for.

Another Hearing Dec. 8 Commissioner Veselka, from Weimar, suggested that the regulations on the use of 2,4-D in other portions of the county, especially in the Weimar area, be removed since it was believed unlikely that damage to the southern portion of the county would result because of the generally prevailing southerly winds during the spring and summer season.

The court agreed to call another hearing on Monday, Dec. 8th on the possibility of passing a resolution calling for deregulation of the area north of IH-10 in the use of 2,4-D.

to dividends shall ever be declared or paid, but any and all profits accruing and earned shall be placed in a surplus fund to be used in furtherance of the purposes and objectives of the corporation.

If the corporation is ever dissolved, assets will be distributed to such charitable or nonprofit organizations as the board of directors may deem proper, and in no circumstances will proceeds be returned to the shareholders. Memberships in the foundation can, however, be sold by the member to some other individual or business at face value.

Primary objective of the foundation will be to purchase or lease, with option to purchase, properties which would be suitable for attracting industry and business to the community.
