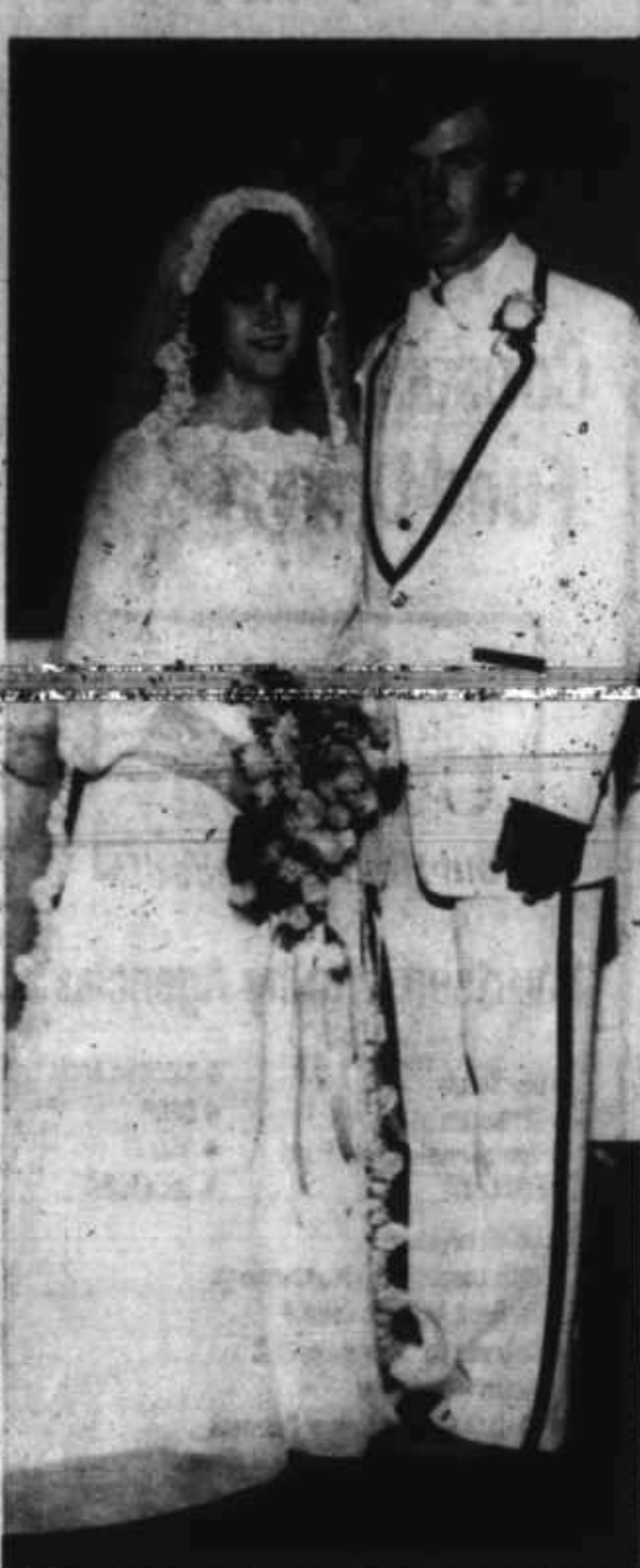


Carolyn Leigh Ilse, Lawrence C. Labay, Jr., Are Wed In Taiton

Miss Carolyn Leigh Ilse became the bride of Lawrence Charles Labay, Jr. in a beautiful double ring ceremony in St. John's Catholic Church in Taiton at two o'clock in the afternoon of Saturday, November 29.

The Rev. Julius Petri, pastor of the Taiton Church, and Monsignor Victor Schmidtsky, pastor of St. Mary's Church in Nade, officiated in the wedding mass and in recitation of the nuptial vows. The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Dickson Ilse of Route 1, El Campo; and Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence C. Labay, Jr. of Nade are parents of the groom.

The church was beautiful for the wedding ceremony with the back and side altars enhanced with greenery. Lighted candles enhanced the aisle. A unity candle was lit by the couple's mothers.

Wedding selections, "With Thee I Go" and "The Wedding Song" were presented by Mrs. Larry Kivon, organist, and Mrs. Eddie Schert, soloist.

The bride, given in marriage by her father was attired in a formal gown of ivory chiffon and Alencon lace. Features of the gown included a fitted bodice applied with lace and roses, a scalloped bodice neckline and full, bishop sleeves that gathered at the wrists with deep Renaissance cuffs of lace. The flowing skirt of chiffon fell slipper-length and swept into a chapel-length train.

As her headress, the bride chose a cathedral-length mantilla, encrusted

with Alencon lace. She carried a bouquet of ivory and peach silk roses, fern, baby's breath, ivory satin ribbon streamers, centered with white orchid and cymbidium orchids.

County Pecan Show, Bake Show Dec. 2-3

The 1980 Colorado/Fayette County Pecan Show and Bake Show will be held December 2 and 3 at the Bishop Forest High School Gym in Schulenburg. The show will be open to the public from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 2 and from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon on Wednesday, December 3.

We encourage you to enter your pecans and help to make this two county show a success. The women and youth are urged to enter the Pecan Bake Show.

Pecan entries are due in the County Extension Office Friday, November 28, 1980. Producers in the Weimar area are urged to enter with Harry Adamek, Charles T. Treby, Jr., or Frank Kolek, Jr. Exhibitors in the Eagle Lake, Garwood, and Nade areas may leave their entries with Rev. Victor Schmidtsky of Nade.

Pecan Show rules are as follows:

1. Pecans must be from the 1980 crop and produced in Colorado or Fayette Counties.
2. Each entry should consist of at least 55 pecans for improved varieties and a minimum of one pound for natives.
3. Pecans must have been grown by the person exhibiting. (A person owning one tree, regardless if it is in an orchard or a yard, is considered a grower).
4. One grower may enter

one entry in each variety class. (Example: John Doe can enter a Desirable, Mahan, Success, etc.).

5. One grower may enter as many natives that he or she has produced. (Natives should be fairly good and not mixed).

6. Pecans (by entry) should be placed in a paper bag with exhibitor's name, address, county and variety if known or native plainly written on the outside of bag.

7. All entries will be judged by competent judges and division winning pecans will be entered in the Regional Pecan Show.

8. Pecans entered in the show will become property of the show. Pecans will be sold and the money will be used to defray the cost of the show.

9. Plaques and ribbons will be awarded to the winning entries.
