

Santa Delayed In Arrival Here But Visit Was Huge Success

Brought By Fire Truck After Helicopter Falls To Start

Although Santa Claus' annual visit to the community was delayed for a half hour due to the fact that the helicopter in which Santa was to arrive failed to start, his annual visit here last Saturday was hailed by the Chamber of Commerce as one of the best with around 700 children and many parents on hand to visit with Santa.

When Dan Thornton, pilot of the Winterman helicopter, landed to transfer Santa Claus from his perch to downtown Eagle Lake, he was unable to get the helicopter started. Nevertheless, Eagle Lake Fire Department was standing by in the event of just such an emergency and Fire Chief J. (Sonny) Spauld and Captain Ronnie Miller went to Santa's aid and brought him to town on the back of one of the department's fire trucks, much to the delight of the huge crowd assembled on the downtown city square for the arrival of this jolly old gentleman.

Santa was greeted on his arrival at the front of the Municipal Building by Chamber of Commerce president Bob McIntire and escorted to the foyer of the building where he visited with the children and he and his helpers, Boy Scouts of Troop 254, passed out bags of fruit.

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Geo. Purefoy New Columbus City Manager

Columbus Mayor Richard Heffley and the Columbus city council met in special

session Monday to approve the application of George Purefoy, 38, of Houston, for the position of city manager effective January 15th, 1981.

Purefoy will succeed Raymond Peters, who has held the Columbus city manager's position since 1971 and is an employee of the city since 1961. Peters will assume a new position of city utilities

director. The new Columbus city manager was the city administrator for the City of Taylor Lake Village, a position he has held since August. Prior to that he was assistant city administrator for three years for the City of Boerne. He is a graduate of the University of Arlington and holds a Master's Degree

in public administration from East Texas State University. A four-member citizens committee headed by former Columbus Mayor W. A. Kuchar, recommended to the council that Purefoy be elected from among a number of applicants. Also on the committee were former assistant city manager Donald Hayek, former alderwoman
