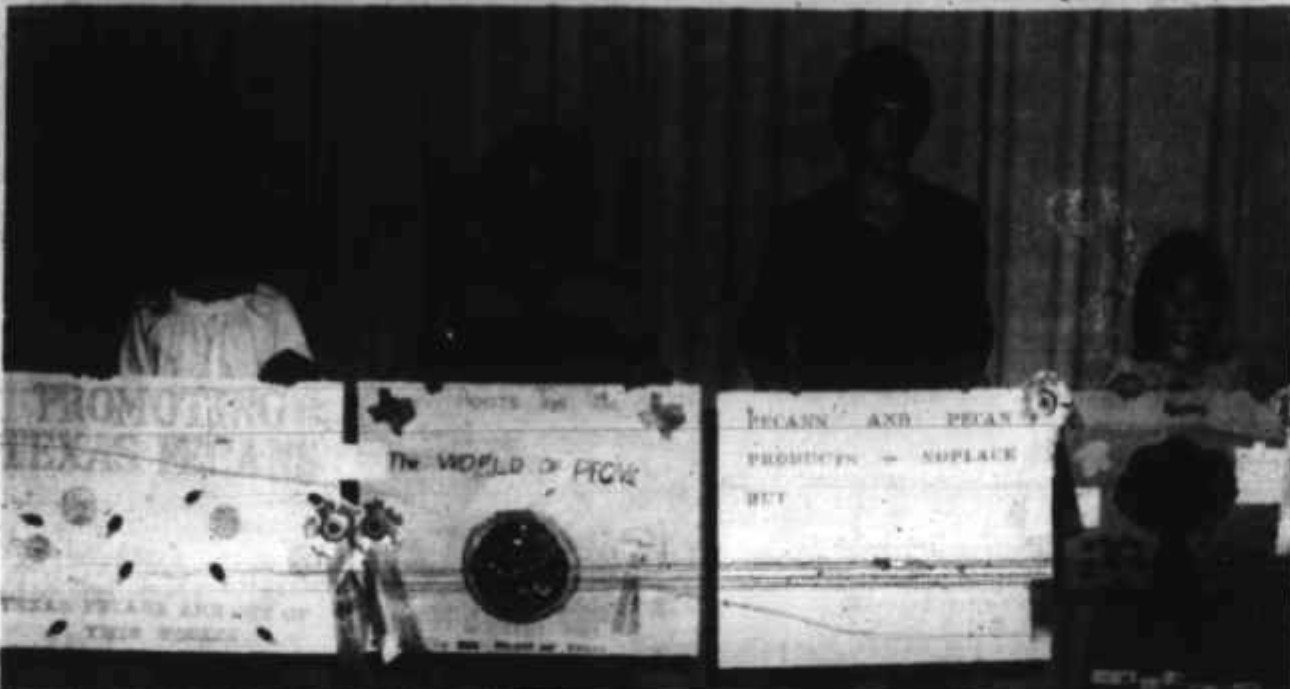
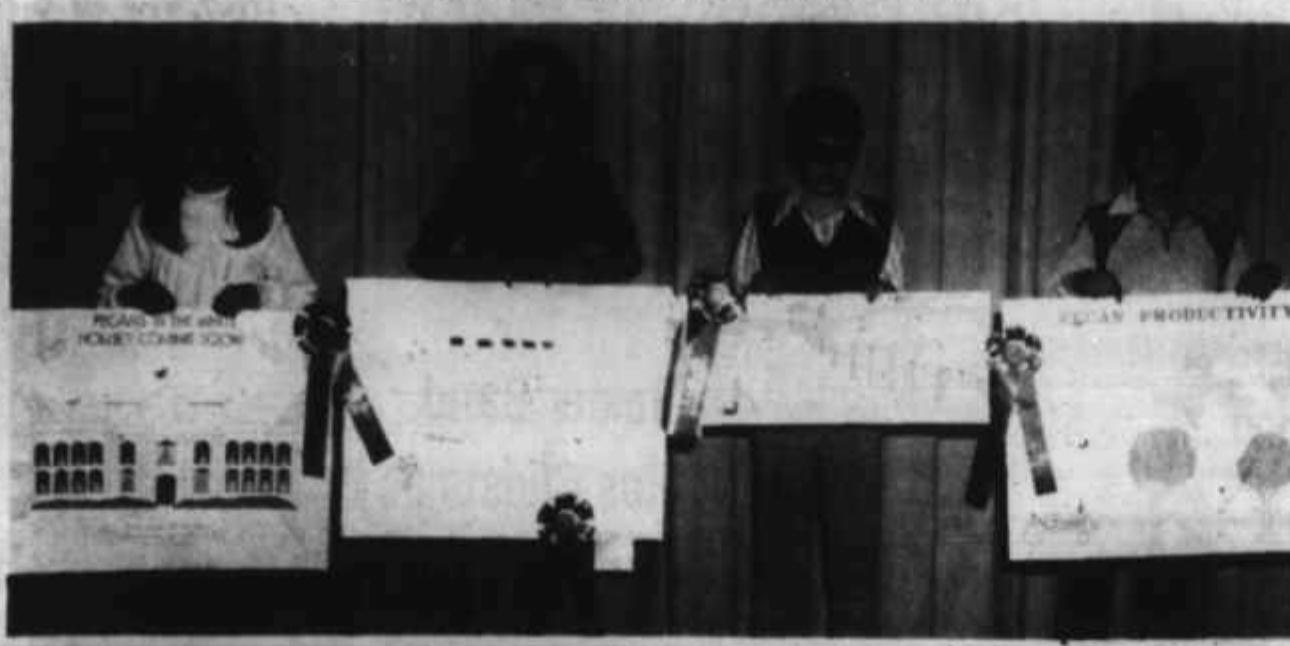
Proceeds from the event will benefit the Colorado County Fair Association. One and all are invited to attend this pre-holiday event.

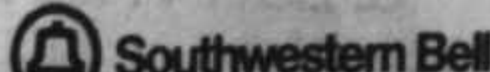
