A Christmas Meditation . . .

One of the most appealing things about Christmas is that for once in the year we can unashamedly immerse ourselves in the familiar. In tradition, there is an age of rapid and alien changes, where the dollar is worth less and goods cost more, where church doors are locked for safety, where people do not know their neighbors. What a relief to find a time when we are surrounded by the familiar: the trees and wreaths and Christmas ornaments, listening to old familiar carols, visiting or hearing from friends and relatives who are far away, celebrating rituals we have followed in our families for years, even generations.

But we must not forget about the reason for all the customs and music and decorations: the breaking into our world of the mysterious, the Holy One of Israel, the miracle of God taking the form of a child; and the shattering of all the familiar ways of thinking about God. The mighty God of Israel, whose might conquered Pharaoh's armies, arrives as a newborn unable to meet his own needs. The Glorious Majesty of the King is not found sitting upon a throne of gold, but lying in a crib of straw. The Creator and Ruler of the Universe is born into a very ordinary family.

Christmas is a time to celebrate the unusual, the strange power and glory of God. Sometimes we believe that God only appears in traditional ways, ways that have grown familiar to us. We forget that God makes himself known in diverse ways. The lightning and thunder of Sinai may also be the still, small voice heard by Elijah. The captivity in Babylon reveals an ancient God who is not only the conqueror of the land of Canaan. The love of the Lord for us may be expressed as forcefully by Good Friday as by Christmas Day.

Christmas is a time to ponder and to pray, for we never know for sure how or when God will act in our lives or in the lives of men and women around us. A childless old couple became the mother and father of the people through whom God chose to reveal Himself. God took a murderer who had difficulty speaking and empowered him to lead his people out of Egypt. And this same God sanctified and ordained a young woman to be the human mother of God's Own Son.

It is at this time of year when we come face to face with the shallowness of our presumptions. We who feel so powerful, but must rely on an infant to give us true life. We who are so comfortable, but whose Saviour sleeps with cattle and sheep. We who want to live life to its fullest, but whose Lord willingly gave up his life for us. We are humbled indeed when we come face to face with the Christ of Christmas.

At the Christmas season we are given a chance to turn our attention, for however briefly, away from the confusion of our age. It is a season for good cheer, the enjoyment of good company, and celebrating the traditional. It is also a time to stand in amazement at the mighty deeds God has brought about for our sake. At Christmas, we are reminded of the great love God has for us at all times and in all seasons.

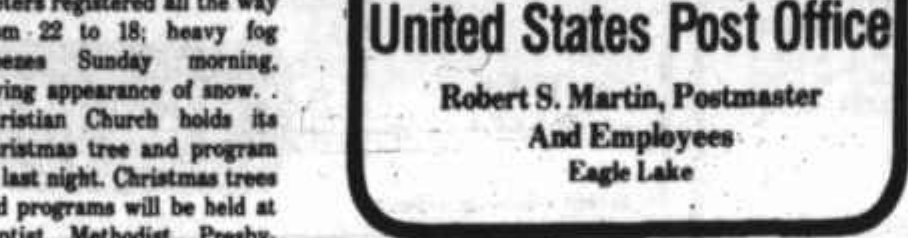

Let's Look Back 48 YEARS AGO

(December 24, 1932)

Epidemic of influenza prevailing throughout Eagle Lake community. But few homes in town and vicinity where illness has not touched and local doctors have been kept busy. East Bernard youth killed in car wreck near Madisonville. With three other students of Kansas school, Harold Kramer, 19-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Otto Kramer, was returning home for Christmas visit. Saturday was coldest day of season through the Eagle Lake section. Local thermometers registered all the way from 22 to 18; heavy fog freezes Sunday morning, giving appearance of snow. Christmas Church holds its Christmas tree and program on last night. Christmas trees and programs will be held at Baptist, Methodist, Presbyterian and Episcopal Churches Saturday night. Eagle Lake will observe Monday as Yule holiday. Christmas coming on Sunday, practically all stores in Eagle Lake will be closed on Monday as holiday. Funeral services for Mrs. Jacquelin Oliphant held here Thursday. Former citizen of Eagle Lake passes away in hospital at Houston Tuesday night following long illness. Baca Orchestra will play at Austin's Hall December 29. John Miles home here burglarized early Wednesday night. Derrick near Nada being taken down. Eagle Lake schools dismiss Thursday. The latest in the differences between Wallis-Orchard Independent School District and the State Property Tax Board continued in the form of a hearing in Austin on December 10.

In earlier efforts Jackson and Raskauskas convinced a SPTB hearing panel and staff that values on land was too high. This resulted in a reduction in land values from \$153,936,968 to \$128,280,807, which should save the taxpayers of the district approximately \$51,300.00.

However, efforts to get additional reductions in values were unsuccessful as the SPTB unanimously approved a recommendation made by a staff member to approve values set by the hearing panel.

Though each member of the SPTB had in hand facts provided by Wallis-Orchard I.S.D. which justified further reduction, the district request was denied.

Superintendent Jackson presented a report to the school board on December 16, 1980.

Jackson feels the district was justified in expecting an additional adjustment of \$16,000,000 in value. This would save the taxpayers approximately \$32,000.
