

CPL explores new power sources for long-range needs

natural gas-and resulting restrictions on its use by utility firms-Central Power and Light Company is turning to other fuels to generate electricity for its customers in South Texas. For the immediate future, CPL will rely heavily on nuclear and coal-fired plants, drawing more than 40% of its production from these two sources by the late 1980s.

But the company is doing long-range planning, too. In cooperation with research agencies and other utilities, CPL is presently sludying several new areas that have the potential to become energy sources many years now; gasification of solid or liquid fuels, geothermal steam, solar repowering and nu-
