### Council OK's \$850,000 Grant Application

Eagle Lake city council met in special session at 12 noon Friday, Jan. 2nd to officially approve the application for a \$850,000 block grant from the Department of Housing and Urban Development for work proposed in the Rice Mill area in the eastern part of the city. Included in the project, if approved by HUD, would be improvement of drainage, street improvements, rehabilitation of substandard housing and demolition of abandoned buildings. Specifically, the application, prepared by Bruce Spitznagel of the Community Development Specialists of La Porte, the funds would include: \$415,000 for drainage and street work; \$350,000 for substandard housing repairs; \$15,000 for demolition; \$30,000 to energy conservation projects; and \$40,000 to administration.

Spitznagel told the council, however, at the December meeting, that competition for available funds for fully-funded Community Development Block Grants is heavy with over 300 cities vying for limited funds for the 1981 program.

The city received a \$750,000 Community Development Block Grant several years ago for similar work in the Flat section of the city and this work has now been virtually completed.

## 2 Die In Wreck Near Sealy Sun.

The second multi-fatality accident in less than two weeks occurred on Highway 36 between Sealy and Walla at 10 p.m. Sunday night. Two Sealy women were killed in a Christmas Eve accident on Highway 36 2.7 miles north of Walla.

Sunday night's accident involved four vehicles. According to Department of Public Safety reports, three of the vehicles were southbound on Highway 36 about 2.2 miles south of Sealy when the driver of the lead car pulled onto the shoulder to allow the two cars behind him to pass. An oncoming vehicle crossed the center-stripe and collided head-on with the second vehicle in the string of three. The two vehicles then collided with the one which had pulled onto the shoulder of the road and the third southbound vehicle piled into the wreckage of the three vehicles in a chain reaction collision.
