## Commr's. Court Handles Long Agenda At First '81 Meeting

Colorado County Commissioners' Court went through a long agenda in the first official session of the court. Monday with Precinct 3 Commissioner Jerome C. Wickes attending his first official session of the court. Wickes succeeded Crockett Leyendecker as the Commissioner from Precinct 3 after his election last November. Leyendecker did not seek re-election.

Other members of the court present for the opening session were County Judge Lester J. Cranek; and Commissioners Otto L. Loessin of Precinct 1; Rafael Veselka of Precinct 2; and L. W. (Bill) Stiles, Jr. of Precinct 4. Also present were County Auditor M. L. Briscoe and Secretary Mrs. Annie Louise Franta.

The court, during its busy agenda, unanimously passed a resolution paying tribute to Leyendecker for twelve years of dedicated service on the county's governing body.

Judge Cranek read the resolution which said in part that Leyendecker "endeavored to represent not only his constituents in Precinct 3 but over the entire county in an untiring and dignified manner." Plans are to present the citation to the retired commissioner in a brief ceremony on Monday, Jan. 26th.

In other action, the court: Approved an application from Industry Telephone Co. to lay phone cable in right of way on the Weishuhn Road in Precinct 3.

Approved a request of Seismograph's Service Corporation to operate a vibrator, a sonar exploratory device, on two miles of County Road 103, known as the Columbus-Byars Road in the Rock Island area.

The company uses ultrasound equipment installed in trucks. Rubber pads are placed on the ground and equipment from the trucks sends sonar waves into the ground without visible penetration of the roadway.

A representative of the firm said that tests will be made about every 440 feet along the two mile stretch of County Road 103. The company will pay the county \$500 per mile for use of the roadway and assumes all liabilities which might arise from the testing program.

To Ask For Bids  
The court voted to advertise for bids, to be opened on Feb. 9th, for malpractice insurance for the four volunteer ambulance corps units operating in this county the present policy expires in February and the new one will be for a one year period).

Bids will also be accepted at the February meeting for the County Depository for the years of 1981 and 1982.

Judge Cranek read a letter from the Texas Bankers Association asking the court for support of legislation which might be forthcoming. In the next session of Congress to remove an Internal Revenue Service decision. The decision by IRS is that banks cannot deduct interest paid as depositor's expense. Judge Cranek pointed out that the ruling will undoubtedly cause the county depository bidders to consider the IRS ruling when making bids in February and said that it is likely that bids such as the 14.7% interest currently received from First State Bank of Columbus.
