Many Speak Out Pro, Con On Allen Creek Nuclear Project

A large number of people from Austin County were joined by others from neighboring counties in limited hearings before the Nuclear Regulatory Commission proceeding on Houston Light and Power Company's application for a permit to build a 1.4 billion nuclear generating station at Allen Creek north of Wallis. The hearings began Monday, Jan. 12th from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., and from 2 to 6 p.m. on Tuesday, Jan. 13th continuing Wednesday in Houston. Proceedings will continue until March 6th at the College of Law in Houston.

Some 60 or so people assembled at the Wallis American Legion Hall to participate or to hear limited statements made by people during the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board hearing in the NRC proceedings for the Light Company's application. Directing the hearing were Gustave A. Lindeberger with the Atomic Safety Licensing Board, Sheldon J. Wolfe of Washington, D.C., attorney for the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, and E. Leonard Cheatum, with the ASLB.

Following opening remarks by the chairman, S. J. Wolfe, those who had registered to speak were called upon to make their statements.

At the University of Houston's Bates College of Law Wednesday the hearings took up the issue related to Environmental Consequences of the plant. The topics considered were the recreation benefits of the 5,000 acres cooling lake, and the effects of radioactivity in the body of water. The second topic involved alternative energies, the use of interconnection to obtain electric power in Houston, and the health and environmental consequences of high power transmission lines on human beings and waterfowl.

Allen Creek intervenors of Houston took an active part in these early hearings. The Allen Creek site is proposed to be 15 miles from Eagle Lake, in Wallis. The NRC Board toured the site on Tuesday morning, January 13th.

Texas To Get \$4.3 Million Fish, Wildlife Aid

Preliminary apportionment of federal aid funds by the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service indicates that Texas has been allocated \$4,300,000 to be used in fish and wildlife restoration projects and hunter safety programs during the fiscal year which began Oct. 1, 1980.

Wildlife restoration projects are allocated \$2,005,000; hunter safety projects, \$1,225,000; and fisheries restoration, \$1,070,000.

Funds for the apportionment were obtained from federal excise taxes on sporting arms and ammunition, some archery equipment, fishing rods, reels, creels, artificial lures and flies.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department said these funds may be used to reimburse the state for 75 percent of expenditures for projects previously approved by the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service.
