Workshop On Computers In Agriculture

Farmers and ranchers are into computers just like the rest of the business world, and the Texas Agricultural Extension Service is working to help them make the most of these technical marvels.

That's the purpose of a workshop on "Computers in Agriculture" to be held in Corpus Christi Jan. 27-28 at the Holiday Inn-Emerald Beach.

This workshop is designed to provide agricultural producers, agricultural leaders, commercial fishermen and Extension personnel an introduction to several of the computers available to them.

Computer programs presently available as well as those soon to be available will be discussed. Also, participants will have opportunity to operate several of the computer programs in "hand-on" sessions.

Speakers include Extension Service management and marine economists and a data processing programmer.

Sen. Bentsen Seeks Royalty Exemption

Senator Lloyd Bentsen on Thursday introduced legislation to exempt from the "windfall profit" tax the first 1,000 barrels of oil a day pumped within the U.S. by an independent producer.

Both producers and royalty owners would be exempt under the bill.

"If we are sincerely concerned about increasing domestic oil and gas production, I can think of no more efficient or effective way to go about it. Year after year it has been demonstrated that independent producers invest \$105 in new production for every \$100 they generate in revenue, and at a time we need every drop of oil we can produce in this country," Bentsen said in Senate remarks accompanying his bill.

What's to be done about it? Mark Goode says his department believes education is the key.

"With the help of the media, newspapers, television and radio, and through our own offices, we are trying more intensively than ever before to educate youngsters and adults alike about the costliness, ugliness and needlessness of littering," Goode said.

During 1979, 6,000 males and 8,678 females in Texas under age 17 were arrested for running away from home.

There is a check list to use in trying to locate a runaway. Check with other family members, friends and relatives. Most can offer guesses where the youth might have gone.

Check the teenager's room for letters from friends, things that happened along the way. Tourists kept an eye on them.
