



Colorado County Go-Texan Day In Houston Tuesday

Tuesday, March 3rd is Colorado County Night at the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. Special features on Colorado County night will include the Colorado County Go-Texan Queen Miss Robin Meyer of Columbus; music by the Weimar High School Band; a relay race between teams from Colorado, Fayette, and Washington Counties; and a fine performance by the Oak Ridge Boys.

Tickets for the 7:45 p.m. performance are \$7.00 each and may be purchased at all banks in the county (including First National Bank of Eagle Lake) through Monday, March 2nd; also at Bumper Crop Ag Service in Weimar; Heinsch's Store in Freising; and Pottor's Western Store in Columbus.

There is a charter bus being provided for those who wish to attend the Rodeo but do not want to drive. The bus will leave the courthouse square in Columbus at 4:00 p.m. Tuesday and leave the Astrodome immediately after the rodeo performance. The cost of the bus trip is \$10.00 per person and reservations can be made by contacting Judge Lester Cranek at the courthouse.

The Colorado County Go-Texan committee reports that there are good seats available for the rodeo performance and the committee urges all county residents to attend the Colorado County Go-Texan activities in the Houston show Tuesday, March 3rd and to cheer for their favorite county participants.

Arrest Made In Cutting Here Feb. 13

Eagle Lake Chief of Police Earl Winebrenner reports that an arrest was made at around 11:30 a.m. last Wed., Feb. 18th in the serious cutting of an 18 year old Mexican alien, Henry Roque of Houston, at the Midnight Bar in this community the night of Friday, Feb. 13th.

Chief Winebrenner said that three witnesses stated they saw the arrested man near the scene of the cutting but could not place the knife in his hands; and Roque reportedly identified the man as his assailant from a photograph. However, the charged man denies participating in the cutting.

Roque was released from the hospital last Tuesday after receiving a number of cuts and stab wounds on his face, arms and back.

The arrested man was arraigned before Justice of the Peace M. M. ... and was charged with aggravated assault and his bond was set at \$2,000. He was released from jail last week under the bond pending action by the next grand jury.

The Headlight agreed to withhold the man's name due to his father's serious heart condition, at least until such time as an indictment is returned or he is no-billed by the next grand jury.

Emergency Lights Stolen From Truck Near Weimar

The theft of emergency lights from a house moving truck parked at a home near Weimar was reported to the County Sheriff's office at 10:15 a.m. Monday.

Columbus Contests
In the City of Columbus election April 4th, terms of Mayor Richard Heffley and Aldermen Thomas Etheridge and Jay Hastedt expire. Heffley has filed for re-election; Etheridge says he will not seek re-election; and Hastedt is undecided. Larry Solansky has filed for an alderman's position.

For the Columbus school board, terms of Mrs. Nina Kraft Burt and Dr. Charles Moeller expire and both have filed for re-election.

East Bernard School Bd.
Two positions will be filled on the East Bernard school board April 4th and both incumbents, Frank Kramr of Position 1; and Charles Chauvin of Position 2, have filed for re-election.

Weimar Elections
Three places will be filled on the Weimar city council on April 4th with incumbent Henry Beyer, Position 3, not seeking re-election since he is moving out of the city limits; while incumbents Don Miser, Position 1, and Bennie Kosler, Position 5, have filed for re-election.

Both incumbents in the Weimar School Board have filed for re-election and include Charise Trefney, Position 1; and Mrs. Laurene Hayward, Position 3.

Absentee voting in the city and school elections will begin Mar. 18th and end Mar. 31st.

Man Arrested After Entry Of Home Mon.
