Citizens of the community will learn with regret of the death of the Rev. Gustave Adolph Schulze of San Antonio, minister of the Holy Memorial United Methodist Church in Eagle Lake in 1941. He is the second former pastor of the church to die in recent weeks, the other being the Rev. J. W. Griffin who died in Austin Feb. 23d. The Rev. Mr. Schulze passed away Feb. 19. Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Mon., Feb. 23 at Allergate United Methodist Church in San Antonio followed by burial in Mission Burial Park North.
