Robert Griffith, owner of Eagle Lake and Strickland Insurance Agency in Eagle Lake, invited farmers and ranchers and other interested persons to attend a seminar on Federal Crop Insurance for the 1981 crop year. The seminar will be held in the conference room of the Community Center beginning at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Mar. 24th.

Ron Jordan of College Station, director of the Federal Crop Insurance program for this area, will be on hand to discuss provisions of the program.

Griffith noted that "no matter what happens between now and harvest, we'll guarantee your yield and protect your income." He is the local agent for the All-Rice Federal Crop Insurance which provides "locked in" guaranteed yield and income for losses from natural disasters such as drought, flood, insects and diseases.

100,000 Damages Asked In IH-10 Accident Feb. 27

A civil suit was filed in District Court in Columbus Monday by Donald Thomas against Enderli Enterprises, Inc. and Robert Charles Hicks seeking a total of \$100,000 in damages resulting from a two-truck accident on IH-10 13.5 miles east of Columbus at 4 a.m. Feb. 27th.

The petition sets out that Hicks was driving a truck owned by Enderli when the truck hit the rear of one driven by Thomas causing injuries and damages. The plaintiff asks \$100,000 plus attorney's fees and costs of court for these alleged injuries and damages.

Trend Resources of Denver, Colo. has completed the No. 1 Mary, a new gas producer on the edge of the Eagle Lake field four miles southeast of Eagle Lake, expanding production in the field. The well is producing from the 9,286 to 9,908 foot level after being drilled to a total depth of 10,050 feet. The well reportedly has potential daily volume of 2 million cubic feet of gas per day on a 15-inch choke and estimated absolute open flow of 2.8 million cubic feet per day.

The well is in the Francis Blundell Survey. Trend has reported the No. 1 Cochran a duster after drilling the well to 2,560 feet; a mile north of Matthews in the James B. "B" Survey. A new location is Delta Drilling Co.'s No. 2 W. K. Lehrer two and three-quarters miles northeast of Garwood in the Samuel Kennedy Survey. The well is projected to be drilled to 12,500 feet as a dual zone wildcat hoping for production at the 4,000 foot and bottomhole depths.
