Meet The Rice Raider Baseball Players

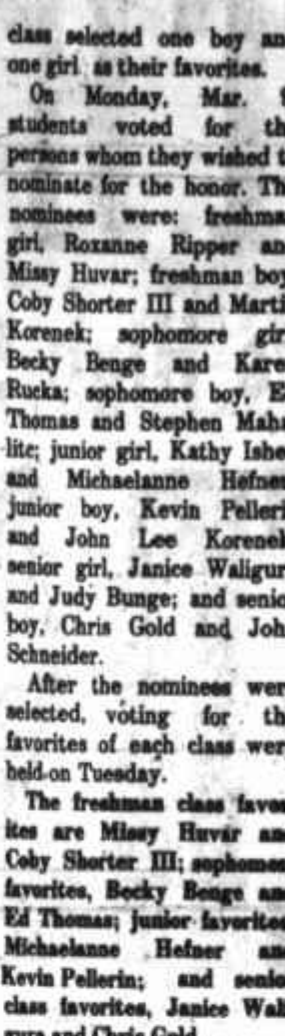

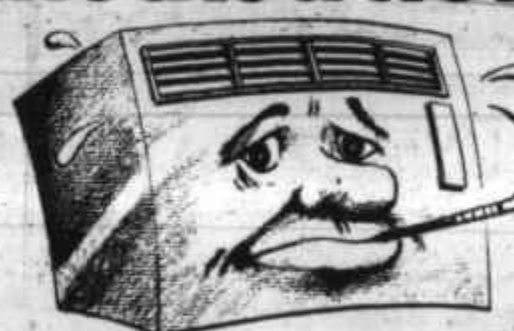
VOE Learns Job Interview Techniques

Before the really hot weather arrives, have a qualified technician clean and check your air conditioning system to make sure it's running at top efficiency.

Preventive maintenance makes good economic sense in at least two ways. First, a tune-up now could prevent a costly breakdown later on. Equally important, an air conditioner in good working order uses less energy, thus helping you keep your electricity bills in line. Dealers report that many units two or more years old may be operating at only 50 per cent of normal efficiency if they have not been properly serviced. The result: paying twice as much as you should to operate your air conditioner!

Don't overcool. Keep your thermostat at the highest comfortable temperature - about 78°. (For each degree of cooling below 78°, you add 14% to the cost of operating your air conditioner.)

- Clean or replace the filter every two weeks.
- Clear obstructions away from the outside sections of central air conditioning to assure free circulation of air.
- Stop air leaks by caulking and weather stripping cracks around windows and doors.
- Use draperies, blinds, shades or awnings to keep direct sunlight out of the house. Provide additional shade by planting trees or shrubs.
