Mrs. Hopkins advised that the Archives Room would not be ready before May. She also stated that A. J. Willbrodt was appointed State Chairman of the Heritage Endorse Committee to compile a list of all opera houses and places of entertainment in Texas Counties.

WINTERMANN LIBRARY TO BE GREATLY EXPANDED

Construction is expected to begin in the immediate future for the expansion of the Eula and David Wintermann Library in Eagle Lake following the acceptance of a \$188,048 bid for the expansion on Tuesday of last week. Contract has been awarded to Scholz Construction Co. of La Grange by the library's board of directors with Eula and David Wintermann to pay for cost of the expansion just as they did the original facilities in 1975.

The expansion will be made to the West and North of the present facility and will take in the present driveway on the north and the parking area at the rear of the present building. The addition will include an enlarged meeting room with allowances for new projection equipment, storage, other features and will be complete with a large built-in projection screen.

New Conf. Room, Archives
There will be a separate conference room for special group and board meetings. A kitchenette will be provided to be used in conjunction with the meeting room and the conference room. An additional restroom with facilities for handicapped persons will also be included in this area of the building.

A new archival room will be provided and will be about three times the size of the current archives space with a

more flexible arrangement for its facilities. There will be two additional book stack areas which will provide more than twice the stack area currently existing. These book stacks will be open to the main room so that the Librarian will have control from the circulation desk area.

The work area of the building will be greatly increased to enable more machines, typewriters, etc., necessary for a more adequate working of the library. The existing construction materials shall be duplicated in most of the building although other complementary materials will be introduced, according to A. J. Willbrodt of Willbrodt and Associates, architects for the project. An additional concept will be a high wall ventilating system which has proved to be successful in many installations of this type. Also, a system of low speed ceiling type fans is being considered.

The members of the Library Board include: Mr. Wintermann as chairman; Don Bendy, vice-chairman; Sue Stansel, secretary; and members Major Bengt, Avia Laughlin, Kathryn McFee, Margo Harrison, Margie Wiese, Ralph Truly, R. R. Wells, Jr., and Robert S. Martin. Bruce Waddell is treasurer.
