Henderson continues to recuperate from first, second and third degree burns over 70% of his body. All blood given during the drive here last week will be credited to Henderson and will be drawn for his use as needed in Hermann Hospital in Houston.

Haynes Heads List; Grammer Named Region Coach Of The Year

Rice High School's Larry Haynes, a unanimous choice on the Class 3A State Tournament all-star team, received several more State and Region honors during the past week, along with teammates David Grammer and Victor Davis and Coach Jack Grammer.

Haynes, a 6'5" senior forward for the State Champion Raiders, was named to the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches' Class 3A all-star team. Joining Haynes on the first team were Kerry Zastupnik of Huffman, Reggie Williams of Coleman, Merritt Williams of North Lamar and Eric Martin of Van Vleet.

Kenneth Johnson, a 6'7" junior from Columbus, was named to the second team. He was the only other area player besides Haynes named to the first, second or third team.

Forms Available At ELPS, ELMS, RHS; Deadline Is April 15

The Eagle Lake Little League has distributed registration forms for its summer baseball and softball program, announces league president Arthur Outterre.

Boys and girls ages 7 to 15 who are interested in playing ball this summer can pick up registration forms in Eagle Lake at the Primary or Middle Schools or at Rice High School in Altair. Teams included in this registration

range from a newly formed 7-year-old softball, T-Ball league for boys and girls to the teenage league for 13, 14 and 15 year old boys.

Players are urged to fill out the forms promptly and return them to the school. Little League officials will pick up the completed forms Friday and on Wednesday of next week, so all forms should be turned in as soon as possible.

Tryouts are slated for April 25-26 for the boys and May 2 for the girls. The tryouts will be held rain or shine, say league officials.

Long, along with Rodney Sanford, James Powell and Ronnie Fry teamed up to give Rice the victory in the mile in the

decisive final event of the meet.

Long's other wins came in the 800 meter run, the high jump and long jump.

Other first place finishes by Rice included Kenneth Hemphill, 200 meter run; Ronnie Fry, 400 meter run; and Calvin Foster, shot put, 44'9".

Second places included: Hemphill, 100 meters; Phillip Schlemmer, 110 high hurdles; and the 400 meter relay (Charles Amos, Fry, Powell, Hemphill).

Third places included: Gary Spencer, mile run; and Rodney Sanford, long jump.

Fourth places included: Gary Spencer, 800 meters; Clarence Spruill, two mile run; Delbert Jarvis, 300 meter hurdles; Mel Pratt, discus; and Powell, high jump.

Fifth places included: Kevin Henderson, 100 meters; and Willie Banks, 400 meters; and sixth place included David Cardenas in the mile.

This Saturday the Raiders will be running in the Rice Relays at the High School on Saturday morning and afternoon and at the Eagle Lake Middle School on Saturday night. The Raiders invite everyone to plan to attend.

Over 300 junior high school and junior varsity athletes will compete this Saturday in the annual Rice Junior High Relays sponsored by the Rice athletic department, with the exciting finals of the running events to be held under the lights at the Eagle Lake Middle School on Saturday night.

All field events and preliminary races will be held at the Rice High School track in Altair beginning at 9:00 a.m. with the finals to be held in Eagle Lake starting at 6:45 on Saturday. Prior to the start of the finals medals will be presented to the winners in the field events during a special ceremony beginning at 6:30 p.m. in Eagle Lake.

Nine girls' teams and nine boys' teams will participate in the junior high division with 10 boys' teams competing in the junior varsity level. Tournament director Cliff Torden has indicated that some top quality athletes will take part in Saturday's meet.

"We are expecting some real good individual performances in the meet," said Torden, "with a tough battle for the team title."
