County Adopts Employee Retirement Option Plan

Colorado County Commissioners' Court decided Monday that employees of the county for ten years and officials with eight years of service can opt to continue participation in the county's group medical plan (at their own expense) upon retirement.

It was noted that if a county employee or official terminates service with the county, for one reason or another, and the employee has 10 years of service and the official 8 years, they can take up the option to continue under the medical health program provided by the county and continue to get the benefits of a group program.

The county employees and officials are now covered under a plan submitted by the Texas Association of Counties, underwritten by Prudential Life Insurance Co., and the new option for retirees or those terminating service was made available for the first time.

The court authorized County Judge Crane to contact two Columbus electrical firms who submitted bids for adding fluorescent lighting and outlets in a garage to be used as a workshop at the Waldvogel Work Center for handicapped persons, for bids for doing the work. He had received two bids for the proposed work, but Commissioner Rafael Veselka suggested that light fixtures removed from the courthouse under the restoration program might be used to reduce the cost. The judge was asked to check with the two bidders and to authorize the work if bids were satisfactory. Under the county's contract with the Travis State School in Austin and San Antonio State Hospital, the county is responsible for capital improvements to the Waldvogel house, property of the county, and the other agencies for general operation and maintenance.

Refuge Funds Authorized The court authorized the

Crane, who suggested the \$25 figure, said that there was no information available at that time on just how much funds would be needed in this area and concluded that the \$25 per month per agent figure was unrealistic. He recommended the allowance be increased from \$25 to \$50 but, then seconded a motion to up the allowance to \$40.

Driver Killed When Van Hits Truck On I-10

A 24-year-old San Antonio man, driver for Producers delivery service, was killed last night when his 1979 Ford van slammed into the rear of a legally parked truck on the shoulder of Interstate 10 2.1 miles west of Weimar at 2 a.m. Saturday.

Investigation of the accident by the Highway Patrol revealed that Gary Clifton, 29, of Calhoun County, Georgia, pulled his 1979 GMC truck and trailer off the highway in order to check a tire that was going flat. Officers said the vehicle was legally parked and Eaton was sitting in the cab awaiting daylight to get help with the tire, when a 1979 Ford Van driven by Dwight Edward Johnson, 24, of San Antonio, slammed into the rear of the truck.

The wreckage of the van had to be pulled apart by wreckers at the scene before Johnson's body could be removed. He apparently died instantly. Officers believe that he might have gone to sleep since there were no skid marks on the highway.

The impact knocked Eaton against the steering wheel injuring his nose and he was treated at Weimar Hospital for the nose injury.
