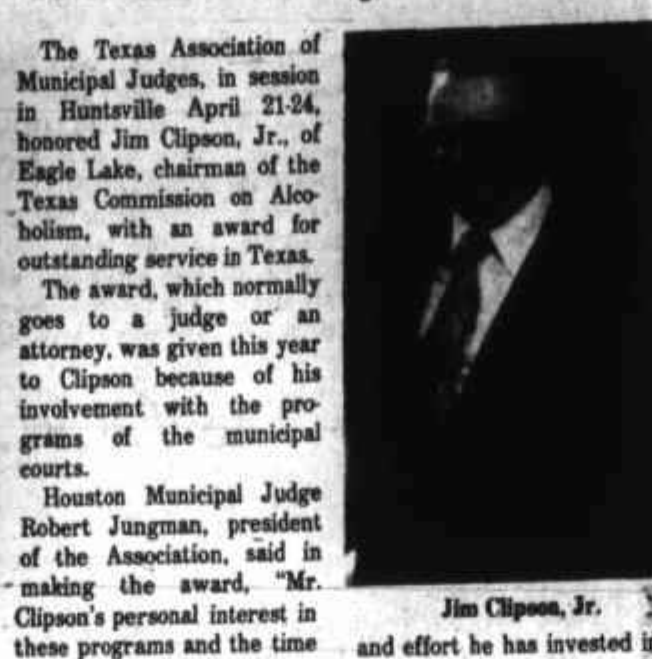
Annette Hotz, Lester Russell Herman Plan June 20 Nuptials

Apply For Homestead Exemptions By Thurs.

Taxpayers in the area are reminded that Thursday of this week (April 30th) is the final date for filing Exemption Affidavits for homestead exemptions with Colorado County, the City of Eagle Lake and the Rice Consolidated Independent School District.

The regular homestead exemption and the special exemption to persons 65 and over, and for disabled veterans on county ad valorem taxes must be signed in the office of County Tax Assessor and Collector Henry J. Hajovsky in the courthouse in Columbus.

The City of Eagle Lake allows a \$7,500 exemption on 1981 taxes to citizens 65 years of age and over and for disabled veterans. City officials point out that the exemption must be applied for annually and will not carry-over from one year to the next.

The Rice School District reminds that April 30th is the deadline for filing for exemptions. Exemption affidavits must be signed in the district's tax office in the Administration Building in Alamo.

The residential homestead exemption on school taxes amount to \$7,500 of the full (or 100%) market value now placed on properties in the county under new state legislation which goes into effect this year. Homesteaded applicants must certify that the property was owned on January 1, 1981 and that it is the only property being claimed for a Residential
