Results Of ACT, SAT, IQ Tests Indicate Needs

RHS Seniors In Premium Course At Or Above Nat'l Avg.

Rice High School counselor William P. (Bill) Carpenter presented to the district's board of education last week a summary of the American College and Scholastic Aptitude Testing Program and also on mental ability tests administered to members of the Rice High School senior class this year.

Carpenter explained that the ACT test results showed that Rice's premium level students (those taking college preparatory courses) ranked near the national level of college-bound students, and above Texas norms, but the class average was below Texas norms in areas of English, Math, Social Studies, Natural Science and Composition.

The report presented by Carpenter was based on test results of 29 students, most of whom plan to attend college or training schools.

ACT Test Results: The counselor noted that most colleges require a composite score of 15 or better in the ACT testing program. The 29 students included in Carpenter's report (not identified in the report) had averages of 14.517 in English, 13.552 in Math, 10.724 in Social Studies, 15.828 in Natural Science, 13.784 in Composition

and IQ of the group averaged 99.138.

By comparison the Texas norms in the same subject areas (as listed earlier) were 16.5, 14.1, 13.1, 17.4, and 15.5; while the college-bound national norm is 17.4 in English (Rice's is 17.8), 16.8 in Math (Rice 17.9), Math 16.6 (Rice 14.1), Natural Science 20.4 (Rice 19.6) and Composition 17.9 (Rice 17.5). The Rice figures in the latter statement are for the premium students or those taking two Algebras, 1 Geometry and Premium English, Science and Social Studies.

The IQ scores of the 29 students tested ranged from a low of 85 to a high of 123.

SAT Test Results: In the Scholastic Aptitude Tests for 20 members of the 1981 senior class, the counselor said the results indicate the Rice seniors ranked equal with the national average on verbal scores. He noted also that the environment in which a student lives obviously has considerable effect on the SAT scores.

Of the 20 listed in the SAT report, all but one indicated they would attend college. Carpenter's report showed that the national average scoring on the SAT test in 1978-79 was 427 in verbal and 467 in Math with men scoring higher than women 431 in verbal to 423 and 423 in math.

The RSH seniors included in the report, averaged 401 on the verbal test and 467 on the math test. Males tested scored 494 and 491 in the two areas compared to 399 and 454 for females.

The principal pointed out that the math score of 467 matched the national average in the 1978-79 scoring but was below the national average in verbal 401 to 427.

The top scoring by a Rice senior was a composite score of 1350 while the lowest was a total of 580. IQ's of the ones included in this report ran from a high of 138 to a low of 94.

Mental Ability Test: The Ois-Lennon Mental Ability Test was given to the 1980-81 freshman class in October, said Counselor Carpenter.

One hundred and thirty-four students were tested with an average MA score of 94.1. The highest IQ score was 143 and the lowest dropped to 63.

Also the counselor reported on the Iowa Test of Educational Ability (basic skills test) in Reading, Language Arts and Math.

The reading test showed beginning freshmen in 1980 had 77 students ranking in the 0-24% level, 24 in the 25-49%, 20 in the 50-74% level and only 13 in the 75% or over.

In language arts, 59 were in the 0-24 group, 42 in the 25-49 group, 16 in the 50-74 and 17 in the 75 and over. In math testing, 55 graded in the 0-24 level, 44 in 25 to 49, 26 in 50 to 74 and only 9 in the 75% and over level.

The diplomas were conferred by the Right Reverend Raphael DesJarlais, O.S.B., president of the Academy.

In the ceremonies, Eddie was awarded the Silver Medal for Achievement in Music, and was presented awards for achievement in Physics, Personal Finance and for his outstanding application to studies.

During his four years at the Academy, he has been a member of the Men's Chorus, the Lector Society and an Honor Roll student. He was recently recognized for ranking among the top ten of his graduating class.

Also recognized during the graduation ceremonies were Andrew and Donald Ruesewald, brothers of Edward. They both received certificates for achievement in Choral Music.

More than sixty courses are offered this summer with classes meeting in the mornings, Monday through Thursday. The 1981 summer term starts June 2 and ends July 9th.

Summer school students register alphabetically June 1 by the following order: 8:30 a.m. - A through D, 9:30 a.m. - E through J, 10:30 a.m. - K through S, and 8:00 a.m. through Z.
