Storm Warnings-- Pay Attention

Recent Texas storms and their damage in terms of human lives and property destruction remind us that storm warnings are a key to preventing much of the possible disaster.

But we have to use the key to make it work: we must pay attention.

Tornado-related deaths

Do not stay in a car or mobile home - These are poor shelters.

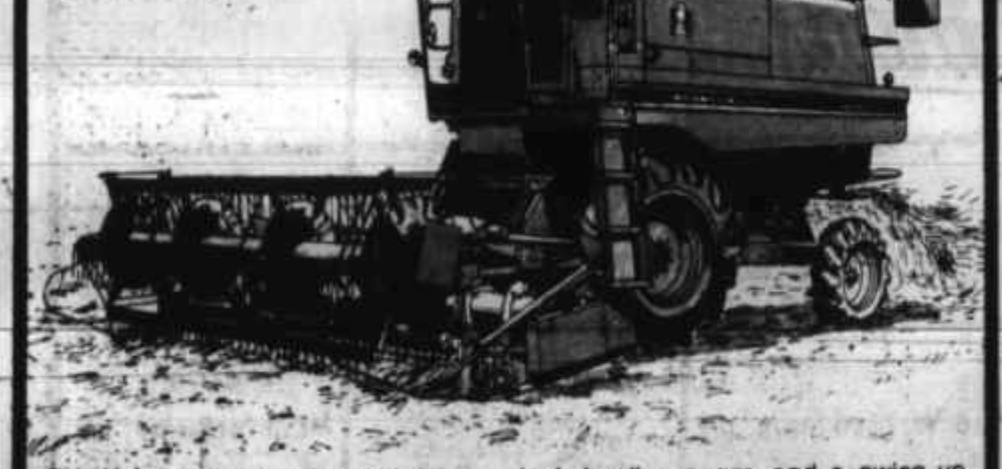
At Home - seek shelter inside the house in a storm cellar or basement - or in a center hall, closet or center room. In the basement, the corner toward the tornado offers the greatest protection. Stay away from windows.

Do keep some windows open to allow for air pressure changes.

At Work - Take cover in a steel-framed or reinforced concrete building. Move to sections of the building where there are internal walls with the greatest support.

Avoid rooms with large free-span roofs and avoid areas where there are

Termites Becoming Visible Now

Termites, those wood destroyers, are around all year causing extensive damage by feeding on wooden structures. However, now is the time of year or "season" that most people discover that they may have an infestation. This process usually begins when "some kind of ants" are flying around their homes. These "ants" are very often the dreaded termite reproductives. They are actually very easy to distinguish from true ants because (1) their 4 wings are of approximately equal length and (2) they do not have narrow "waists". What is the next step to termite control? It is often necessary to call a professional ant pest control service. Finding termite reproductives does not always mean there is an infestation in the house. However, the premises should be inspected to determine their source.

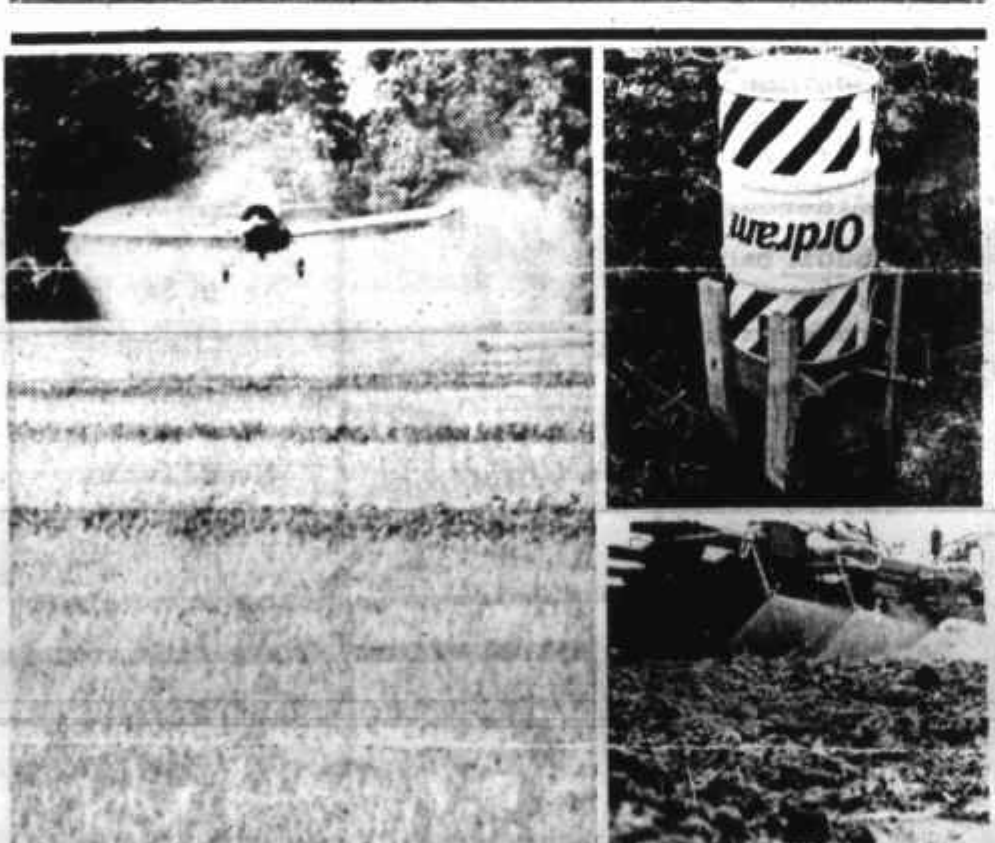
The title for his dissertation which was part of the requirements for the degree was "Small Farm Operators in Texas: Their Information Needs and Sources."

The always popular "Rice High School Song" and "Go, Raiders, Go" concluded the full band program.

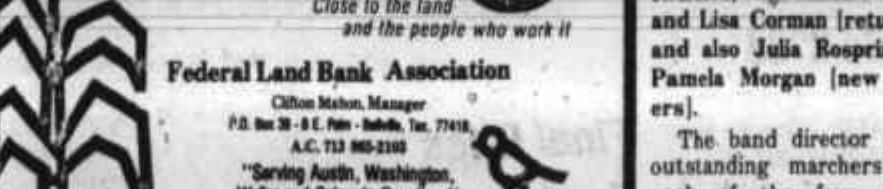
Stage Band Performs

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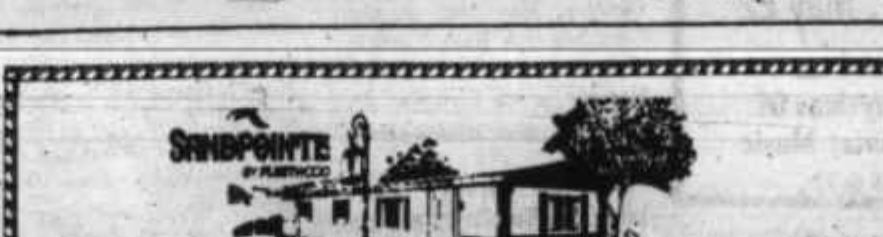
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Historical Comm. To Meet This Thursday
